1. ENEMY:

a. No units in contact. Enemy withdrawing on division front and only resistance is scattered pockets across (to west) OISE RIVER - no tanks encountered.

b. Elements of two regiments of 342 Infantry Division now in area NW of COMPIEGNE; and 47th Infantry Division believed to be in area north of VILLENEUVE (3691) - MONTAUBAN (1786). A number of reports place concentration of both arm and 105 mm artillery in vicinity of COMPIEGNE.

c. For the major part of the month slight enemy resistance was encountered, most of their activity being confined to rear guard and delaying action. Much of this was small in size and merely harassing in effect.

During first days the resistance was strong in the 2d Inf. Division section but gradually steadily pushed back. This was in vicinity of REUIL and south. No enemy tank attacks were made, except one limited penetration in area of lower Infantry vicinity of GATHIEU during night of 11 August. These did not reach our own positions. From 12 August to 17 August evening resistance was very limited and often none was encountered. On 17 August battalion remained in location vicinity until 20 August when it moved to new sector in area of VILLENEUVE.

Enemy fought delaying action with small groups in division area north to LA NEEDJARG and toward AISNE river. Heavy resistance was encountered at LIMBUS.

After leaving area of LIMBUS, no enemy was contacted until 23 August in area NW of PARIS (St Denis and Le Bourget) and toward COMPIEGNE. No real resistance was met as all enemy moved out prior to arrival of our troops. This situation was continuing at close of period with Battalion - South and SW of COMPIEGNE.

d. Enemy located in vicinity of COMPIEGNE but morale appears very low and they are withdrawing with little artillery or tank support. Knowledge of our situation probably very limited.

e. Enemy may continue to defend crossing sites of OISE RIVER and AISNE RIVER with strong local forces while organization to North withdraw eastwards or may withdraw northward to position ATRVILLE (7519) - NEYON (5019) while delaying our advance with small detachments at critical points. Possibility of enemy counterattack considered unlikely as they have demolished bridge and their forces are limited and relatively unorganized.

2. OWN SITUATION:

c. Attached to 28th Infantry Division Artillery:

d. This Battalion attached to 803rd T.D.Bn. and both battalions in general support of the 28th Infantry Division, period 1-2 August 1944; Then 630th I.A.Bn attached 28th Division Artillery. The following operational procedure for the companies for the month was: Company "A" general support of 109th Infantry C.T; Company "B" 110th Infantry C.T; Company "C", 112th Infantry C.T. When a C.T. was not committed the respective company tied in with a FA Battalion and was available for an indirect fire mission. (2061 rds. I.K. expended for period). The Division advance has been rapid and only in a few instances the objectives not reached on schedule and they were

in the hedgerow country. No organized resistance in strength was encountered. Enemy tanks were reported at various times to our front but only once did tanks penetrate the LIA then only to a depth of about 300 yards. After darkness turned their lights on fired a few rounds and withdrew south of GRANGE. Company "A" 303rd T.B.Dn attached 09 - 17 August 1944. 17 - 20 August 1944 hostilities ceased. Battalion in position S. of GRANGE (2 MI) performed maintenance on guns, small arms, and vehicle. Ordnance inspected and found all very satisfactory. 21 August 1944 Battalion with Companies supporting C.R.'s moved vicinity 4 miles south of VILLENEUVE, the next few days were spent advancing toward the objective SILLERY. The British relieved the Division, 26 August 1944. Battalion moved vicinity of LA MAZELLE, Division assembly area, performed maintenance. 28 August 1944 moved vicinity LA MAZELLE. 29 August 1944 moved to 1000 1000 (Paris). Companies paraded in Paris and moved vicinity of LA COURDUROL after parade with C.R.'s. The Division advanced toward objective SOUILLY. At close of report (see overlay incl A1) vicinity of MONT STE MAXENCE and VERGERIE.

e. Combat efficiency - Excellent.

f. 28th Infantry Division objectives were advanced upon and secured with little delay. Companies supporting C.R.'s continued forward reconnaissance for gun position and road nets throughout operations and were well abreast of the entire situation at all times. One enemy battery of F.A. and 2 supply trucks neutralized by indirect fire. 2 MG nests neutralized by direct fire, reconnaissance platoon. Five (5) Enemy killed by small arms, 137 captured.
