Sergeant GEOMGE T HAWLET 20536870, 638th Tank Destroyer Battalion (Attached 84th Infantry Division), United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 12 April 1945. Leading a regimental combat team when informed of enemy troops preparing to effect a withdrawal from positions nearby, Sergeant Hawley employing skillful tactice, successfully captured two bridges which the enemy was preparing to destroy. Proceeding to a nearby town and sensing a trap, Sergeant Hawley, when enemy infantry and armor disclosed their positions and initiated an assault, delivered Machine gun fire, upon the hostile forces, forcing their withdrawal and avoiding an ambush of his own column. The interpid actions, superior headership and aggressive fighting spirit displayed by Sergeant Hawley reflect high oredit upon himself and the military service. Entered military service from Indiana.
