HEADQUARTERS 776TH TANK DESTROYER BATTALION A.P.C. 464

30 November 1943

at 163006, Company "C" at 193058, Reconnaissance Company at 22905h, Rear schelon at 227056, Battalion C.P. at 188060. Weather: Overcast. No change in positions of Companies "A", "B", "C" and Reconnaissance. Rear schelon moved to 227056, closing at 0630. Battalion C.P. moved to 188060, closing at 0700. All security sections and Company rear echelons moved to vicinity of 227056. Firing companies now limited to K-10's, half-tracks and a few 1/h ton h x h vehicles each. This was to lessen traffic congestion on any forward movements of the Companies.

1 November 1913 - No Change. Companies reverted to Battalion control at 0900. Companies to remain in present positions until road clearance from higher headquarters is obtained for them to move forward.

at 1631hh, Company "C" at 1h9118, Reconsaissance Company at 22905h, Rear Echelon at 298992, Battalion CP at 1681h2. Weather: Clear. Company "A" moved from 20206h to 1531h7, closing at 0300. Company "B" moved from 163066 to 1631hh closing at 0100. Company "C" moved from 193058 to 1h9118. Battalion CP moved from 188060 to 1681h2, closing at 1200. Esttalion, Company "A" and Company "C" to reconnoiter for direct fire positions in the vicinity of Capriati, Italy. No mission as of 1000 hours. Reconnaissance Company - no missions.

3 November 1943 - (Weather: Clear) Company "A" moved from 153147 to 117177, closing at 1200, Company "B" moved from 163144 to 132178, closing at 2000, Company "C" moved from 149118 to 126183, closing at 0100. No change in positions of Reconnaissance Company, Rear Echelon and Battalion CP. Companies "A", "B" and "C" to support attack as Artillery (as per FO #15 Hq 34th Infantry Division dated 3 November, 1943. In the event of any tank attack the companies will be moved by the Battalion Commanding Officer to direct fire positions. Reconnaissance Company - no missions, except for minesweepers sweeping roads between Fratella, Italy, and Capriati, Italy.

4 November 1943 - (Weather: Clear) Companies "A", "B" and "C" supported attack as artillery and remained in their present positions. No enemy tank threat as of 1000 hours. Reconnaissance Company - no change, no missions. Minesweepers in the vicinity of Capriati, Italy, sent back to their organization Battalion CF, Rear Echelon - no change.

5 November 1943 - (Weather: Clear) One (1) platoon of Company "G" moved to 122181.

6 November 1943 - (Weather: Clear) Companies "A", "B" and "C" no change in positions - no missions. Reconnaissance Company moved from 22905h to 145115, closing at 1500. No missions except for one (1) platoon reconnoitering in vicinity southwest of Macchia, Italy for passable roads and M-10 direct and indirect firing positions. Battalion CP moved from 168142 to 122180, closing at 0800. Rear Echelon - no change.

7 November 1943 - Seather: clear and cool - No change in operations.



8 November 19h3 (Weather: cloudy and light showers). Terrain very very muddy. Companies """, "B" and "C" moved to following positions, supporting Task Force "A" attack (objective Montaquila, Italy, and Colli, Italy, to out road of Corman retreat) (as per FO #16 Eq 3hth Infantry division dated 7 Ecvember 19h3) as artiller; and direct fire support.

Company "A" moved from 117177 to 122259 Company "B" moved from 132178 to 107258 Company "G" moved from 133179 to 108252

all companies closing at 1800. Battalion OF moved from 122180 to 102250, closing at 1800. Recommissance Company moved from 145115 to 122180, closing at 1900 - No mission. Rear Schelon moved from 220063 to 145115 (reatelia, Italy) closing at 1900.

9 November 1943 (Seather: cloudy and cool). Companies "A",
"B" and "C" still supporting Task Force "A" attack. No change in positions
of Companies "B" and "C". Company "A" at 110253. Two (2) plateons from
Company "A" noved forward at 1800 to vicinity of Montaquila, Italy, to
protect left flank of Task Force against tank or of gun attack in direct
support of Infantry. One plateon from Reconnaissance Company reconnoitering
East of river towards Colli for gun positions and passable routes for the
Task Force. Battalion CF at 100245. Reconnaissance Company - no change,
Rear Echelon - no change.

10 November 1913 (Seather: cloudy) No change in missions of Companies "A", "B" and "C". They remain in present positions.

Recommissance Company moved from 122180 to 131274, closing at 1600.

Recommissance platoons reconnoitering to the North from Macchia, Italy, to Formalli, Italy, and Macchia, Italy, to Colli, Italy, for passable routes. Rattalion Gr - no change, Near Echelon - no change.

11 November 19h3 (Weather: clear and cool) One battery of six guns from Company "A" moved to 122259 at 1500 prepared to fire North



12 hovember 1943 (Seather: clear). No change in operations.

13 November 1943 (Neather: clear). No change. Battalion reverted to Division Artillery control, remaining in present positions.

"A" Company fired 476 rounds, "B" Company fired 465 rounds, "C" Company fired 502. Reconnaissance Company — no mission — no change. Battalion CP — moved from 102242 to 094325, vicinity sast of Colli, closing at 1500 hours.
