## SUMMARY:

A. This Battalion continued its attachment to the 4th Infantry Division until 28 January 1945 when the 4th Infantry Division was relieved by the 80th Infantry Division, to which this Battalion was in turn attached to.

The primary mission of this Battalion, which was the same with both divisions, was defense against possible enemy tank attacks. The firing companies were attached to the infantry regiments with individual platoons in support of the division artiblery for indirect fire missions.

The front remained comparitively quiet with occassional enemy artillery fire and several instances of enemy planes strafing and bombing our positions.
