I -- AWAED OF SILVER STAR. Under the previsions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as anonded, the Silver Star is awarded to following named individuals:

Technician Fourth Grade Vincent T. Mues, 32698853, Field Artillery, Company "A", 824th Tank Destroyer Battalion. For gallantry in action. During the period 31 December 1944 to 1 January 1945, near Hostenback, Gergany, Sergeant Mues, half-track driver, informed of an indiment counterattack, was ordered to withdrew with his vehicle. As he moved to the rear the vehicles were subjected to an intense barrage of energy mortar fire. Sergeant Mues maneuvered his vehicle through the fire successfully but the vehicle behind him was struck by mortarfire and put out of action temporarily. Sergeant Mues left his own vehicle in cover, went to the read junction and and a heil of energy fire drove the stalled vehicle to safety. He continued to drive it for the remainder of the night from position to position under constant energy machine gun, shall arms, artillery and mortar fire thereby saving the gun and its crew. Sergeant Mues' actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Readence: Woodhaven, New York.

Private Edwin J. Fiedler, 36780719, Field Artillery, Company "A", 824th Tank Destroyer Battalian. For gallantry in action. On 30 November 1944, in the vicinity of Unwiller, France, Private Fiedler, a commence of a three-inch towed gun, while placing his gun into position was subjected to an intense barrage of energy artillory. Having had no time in which to seek protection or dig in, casunlies were mounting rapidly. Observing a wounded comrade lying in an exposed position on the open terrain Frivate Fiedler dashed to the side of the wounded man and carried him 75 yards through deep and elippery mad under constant energy fire to reach an exposation vehicle. Private Fiedler's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Belleville, Illinois.

Sergeant Joseph V. Harte, 32698951, Field Artillery, Company "C", 824th Tank Destroyer Battalion. For gallantry in action. On 14 April 1945, in the vicinity of Ober Heinrist, Germany, Sergeant Harte and his eres were subjected to intense energy artillery fire which blasted the wall of a house down on tham. Despite injuries to the erew, Sergeant Harte, hinself injured, directed the extrication of the vehicle in order that they would be able to accompany infantry units going forward to repulse a counterattack. Although the guns were damaged beyond their ability to fire, Sergeant Harte drove his vahicle forward and succeuded in assisting in the repulsion of the energy's proposed counterattack. Sergeant Harte's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Besidence: Brocklyn, New York.

I -- AWARD OF ERONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600+45, 22 September 1943, as smended, the Bronze Star Modal is awarded to following assed individuals:

Private First Class Harland B. Davis, 36401259, Infantry, Company "F", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 15 March 1945 near Zinswiller, France, when in intense wrillary barrage wounded his comrade, Friste Davis left the Shelter of his fox hole and ran 75 yards through the barrage to the side of the wounded man. After Odministering first aid, he dragged the casualty to a fox hole which was too small to hold both men. Placing the casualty in the fox hole, Friste Davis remained beside him rendering aid for thirty minutes until the artillary barrage lifted. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Highland, Michigan.

Technical Sergenht Colin E. Spencer, 14(21185, Field Artillery, Headquarters Battery, 382d Field Artillery Battalich. For heroic achievement in action. On 2 May 1945, near Seefeld, Austrin, when it became imperative to lay a communication line to the Linison Officer, Sergeant Spencer was given the tack. Although not knowing the exact location of the Linison Officer, he started laying the line. After bypassing two enemy patrols he reached the coord make, where the officer was last reported, but unable to find him, Sergean's Spencer continued on. Finally locating the officer, he established communications' enabling artillery fire to be directed nore accurately. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Elekory, North Caroline.

Private First Class Carl J. Efford, 33903938, Infontry, Company "F\*, Allth Infontry Regimént. For heroism in action. On D December 1984, near Behren, France, when a rifle plateon, attacking high ground was pinhed down by intense enemy fire, Frivate Efford placed his mechino gan in an exposed position and fired on three enemy employments. Although the hostile fire was directed upon his position, he remained and directed accurate fire, killing three enemy machine guanters and forcing the remainder of the creas to flee in disorder. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Haltinore, Maryland.

Private First Class "illian Mielotz, 36818191, Infantry, Company "F", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On the night of 28 November 1944 Private Mielotz was guarding the company command post in Andhau, France, when he observed an ensay soldler in a vineyerd 50 yards distant. Firing his rifle, Private Mielotz choked toward the soldier, demanding his surrender. Observing nine more of the ensay about to ambash the command post, he opened fire and, despite the ensay's close range fire, killed two of the ensay and forced the remainder to flee. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Milweukee, Misconsin.

Staff Sergeant Charles E. Pepper, Jr., 14157891, Infentry, Company "F", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 16 March 1945 near Zinswiller, France, Sergeant Pepper volunteered to clear a read of antitark mines in order that supporting tanks could be brought up. Disregarding mortar and machine gan fire, he moved down the side of the road. Upto reaching the mines he tied four of them together and detonated them in a safe position. After he removed the mines, a platoon of tanks moved forward and directed effective fire into the enemy employments. His actions'reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Pittsburg, Temmesses

FIRST LIEUTEMANT WILLIAM C. DEEKLE, JR., 026310, Infantry, Company "B", 410th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 22 April 1945, while recommutering a route of approach to Gutenberg, Germany, LIEUTEMANT DEEKLE was subjected to artillery and small arms fire but continued on and formed a plan for the clearing of the town. Sending his runner back to bring up his company, he placed hinself at its head and led it down a 300 foot cliff and cleared the town. His outstanding leadership and planning emabled the town to be taken without loss to our troops and reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Fast Greenwich, Khode Taland.

Staff Sergebut Joseph S. Zielonka, 36549192, (then Sergeant), Infantry, Company "B", 410th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 23 January 1945, near Schillersdorf, France, Sergeant Zielonka was injured . during a counterattack by SS Troops. Although his arm and shoulder were temporarily paralyzed, he remained with his michine gan section and directed the repair of one gan. Discovering an annunition shortage, he made his way alone over 500 gards and returned with the vital annunition. Only then did he permit himself to be even stod. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Detroit, Michigan.

Private First Class Raymond E. "Boten, 6389924, Infantry, Chanon Company, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 10 January 1945 near Behren, France, when Company "P", 411th Infantry, was ordered to withdraw, fire from two machine guns and snipers prevented its withdrawal. Private "Boten, called for support from Cannon Company and learning of an ammunition shorts ge used only three rounds to adjust fire on the enemy emplocements and then directed fire which eliminated the two machine guns, killing five of the eveny and forcing the anipers to withdraw. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military prvice. Residence: Wass, North Carolina.

Surgeant Diego C. Rosss, 38462856, Infantry, Company "F", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 9 February 1945, Surgeant Rosaq volunteered to lead a reconnaissance patrol to determine enery dispositions near Bischholtz, France. Then fixed upon by the energy, he cautioned his men not to roturn the fire. After obtaining valueble information, he led the patrol back to friendly lines by crawling through a mine field. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence; Helotes, Textsd.

Technician Third Grade Henry Unger, 35530391, Infantry, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Seventh Army, (then Headquarters Company, 411th Infactry Regiment). For heroic schlevement in action. On 18 March 1945, near Wingen, France, when a sniper fired upon the IPW team's vehicle, Technician Unger immedistely lesped from it and dashed toward the sniper's position. Disregarding the sniper's fire, he charged the position, firing his pistel forcing the enemy to surrender. Questioning the prisoner, he obtained valuable information of other snipers and positions which was rapidly passed on to forward rifle companies, permitting the capture of them without casualties to our troops. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Detroit, Michigan.

private First Class Laynard A. Brooks, 31466856, Infantry, Company "A", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 19 December 1944, near Reisdorf, Oermany, when the enemy three granades into his company's positions, Private Scoke stood up in his position and hurled several fragmentation granades into the hostile tranches. Then rising again, he fired his automatic rifle, forcing the enemy to take shelter in a pillbox. Private Brooks contimued to fire on the emplacement, enabling his company to have from its position and he evaluate the wounded. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Staff Sargeant Samuel 7. Gann, 38467903, (then Private Pirst Glass), Infantry, Company "A", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 24 November 1944, near Maisongoutte, France, when machine gun fire on the company's flank inflicted several desualties, Sorgeant Gann mineuvered through the hostile fire and located the mostile gun. He fired his automatic rifle from the hip, silencing the machine gan and killing a four man crew. Sergeant Gann's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military survice. First Surgeant John A. Loveld, 6861608, Infantry, Company "D", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 4 May 1945 in Breamer, Austria, Surgeant Loveld organized a motorized patrol of two vehicles to advance through nostile territory to contact elements of the Fifth Army in Italy. Encoute, Surgeant Loveld passed artillery crews and encay road blocks. At one point when four of the encay stopped the patrol at a road blocks. Surgeant Loveld fully leaded a mounted maching gat, ordered the gate to be opened, and continued on. Technician Third Grede Janes M. Smith, 34494919, Medical Department, Medical Detachment, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 23 November 1924, near Naisongoutte, France, when artillery fire inflicted cookelties, Technician Smith mode his way through the hostile fire and administered aid. After all the casualties had been excusted, he then searched the entire area for additional casualties before seeking cover. Technician Smith's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military services. Residence: Decaturville, Tennessee.

Technical Sergeant Elmer W. Louf, 33267202, Medical Department, Medical Detachment, Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 26 November 1944 in Maicongoutte, France, when artillery fire struck a vehicle and set it into flames, Sergeant Lauf, advanced toward the whicle. Defore reaching the vehicle, a shell burst wounded two nearby soldiers and himself. Disregarding his own wound, Sergeant Lauf chrried one of the near to the aid station, and then returning to the vehicle, searched the area for cassaltice, before allowing his injury to be dressed.
