1. a. (1) Total enemy on LUZON estimated at 160,000, including 104,000 combat troops and at least one armored division. Mobile combat troops in CENTRAL LUZON number 36,000 and garrison troops in that area more than 25,000. Reported strength in PANGASINAN PROVINCE was 15,400 of whom 14,625 were infantry. LINGAYEN GULF defense has been coordinated into a special command under a Lieutenant General with headquarters at URDINETAA.

(2) CLARK FIELD Air Center is approximately 30 minutes flying time from the OBJECTIVE AREA. It has 16 operational air fields, which are expected to constitute the background of air defense for the entire island. As of 12 November there were 396 planes in LUZON and an additional 207 at other points in the PHILIPPINES. GHQ estimates that the enemy is able to stage in more than 600 additional aircraft. More than 200 of the present complement are fighters. Immediate and sustained air opposition can be expected. There is an operational single-strip air field 3/4 miles NE of LINGAYEN.

(3) Large scale troop and supply movements have been reported at SAN FERNANDO since early October. Additional defenses are under construction from LINGAYEN to SAN FABIAN, including emplacements for large coastal guns. The only emplacements known to be occupied, however, are a few hundred yards S of SAN FERNANDO where there is a battery of 13 155 mm guns. A defense system including tanks and artillery has been set up on a line ROSARIO - MANOAG. Numerous pillboxes and machine gun nests have been observed in the beach areas.

(4) LINGAYEN GULF is mined but aerial reconnaissance has not been able to detect underwater obstacles at the beaches. Previous Japanese tactics suggest that they exist. BEACH WHITE 3 shows a double line of trenches and pillboxes and numerous MG positions, including AA on the right flank. Line paralleling the tide mark on BEACH WHITE 2 is probably a barricade of concertina wire supported by fire. Some of the numerous CA emplacements will probably be occupied and FA fire may be received from direction ROSARIO. Excellent L/T roads lead to beaches and permit early reinforcement of enemy positions.

- b. (1) Forces of the SOUTHWEST PACIFIC covered and supported by the THIRD FLEET, 14th and 20th AIR FORCES will continue offensive operations to reoccupy the PHILIPPINES.

(2) 43rd INFANTRY DIVISION, reinforced will land in the SAN FABIAN - RAMON Area, establishing an initial beachhead, and expanding it to the limit of the Army beachhead. It will protect the left flank of the SIXTH ARMY and establish and maintain contact with the 6th INFANTRY DIVISION on its right and the 158th RCT, landing S plus 2, on the left flank.

(3) Relations, with disposition of, or employment of civilian population will be under control of PHILIPPINE CIVIL AFFAIRS UNIT (PCAU).

2. a. 826th Amph Trac Bn will land 103rd, 169th and 172nd RCT Assault Bns on BEACH WHITE 1, 2, and 3, at H-Hour, S-Day, (in accordance with Movement Table, FO #1, Hq, 43rd Div, 25 Nov 44). Will immediately upon release of respective RCT, revert to operational control 533rd EB&SR. 826th Amph Trac Bn Hq will establish liaison with CO 533rd EB&SR and with Maj HILL, Beachmaster, BEACH WHITE 3, at H plus 60.

Troops: See Paragraph 2c, FO #1, 43rd Div Hq, 25 Nov 44.

3. a. (1) Co "B", 826th Amph Trac Bn will land 103rd, 169th and 172nd RCT Assault Bns, in accordance with FO #1, Hq, 43rd div, 25 Nov 44. Co Comdr will accompany 1st Plat, Co "B", 826th Amph Trac Bn to BEACH WHITE 2 and immediately upon landing will establish comm liaison with Beachmaster BEACH WHITE 2 (Lt Col McLallen) and regulate use of 1st Plat for further employment under operational control of 533rd EB&SR w/Co "B" (-2nd and 3rd Plats).

- b. (1) 1st Plat lands 3rd Bn, 169th RCT on BEACH WHITE 2, at H-hour, S-Day, on a broad front (in accordance with FO #1, Hq, 169th RCT, 1 Dec 44).

(2) Immediately upon release of 3rd Bn, 169th RCT, CO, 1st Plat will revert to operational control of 533rd EB&SR on BEACH WHITE 2, (Lt Col McLallen) and will assemble for further missions. (See Overlay).

- c. (1) 3rd Plat, Co "B", 826th Amph Trac Bn will land 2nd Bn, 172nd RCT on BEACH WHITE 1, at H-Hour, S-Day, (in accordance with FO #1, Hq, 172nd RCT, 11 Dec 44).

(2) Immediately upon release of 2nd Bn, 172nd RCT, 2nd Plat will revert to operational control 533rd EB&SR on BEACH WHITE 3, under direct control of Maj HILL. Bn S-X and/or Bn S-3 (Laj TUCKETT) will have established liaison with Laj HILL for coordination and command liaison, H plus 60. Assembly Area (See Overlay)(See FO #1, 172nd RCT, 11 Dec 44).

- d. (1) 2nd Plat, Co "B", 826th Amph Trac Bn will land 3rd Bn, 103rd RCT H-Hour, S-Day on BEACH WHITE 3, advance to within foliage line of beach, where 3rd Bn, 103rd RCT, will dismount. Vehicles will remain in place after unloading of 3rd Bn, 103rd RCT. Will load elements of 2nd Bn, 103rd RCT, H plus Hr, S-Day, at foliage line BEACH WHITE 3, pass thru elements of 3rd Bn, 103rd RCT, in corridor between SAN FABIAN and the BUED RIVER; advance inland by bounds, preceded by foot patrols at not less than 400 yds, and assist in capture of SAN JACINTO.

(2) Immediately upon release of 2nd Bn, 103rd RCT, 2nd Plat will revert to operational control 533rd EB&SR and will assemble in Bn Assembly Area (See Overlay) for further missions.

(3) 2nd Plat will immediately upon reaching beach, designate one vehicle that will wait on beach till POL Supplies are placed ashore. This vehicle will, as soon as practicable, refuel and make turn about trips as is necessary to suit tactical situation. This vehicle will not under any circumstances be loaded w/troops for forward movement. POL to be obtained dumps BEACH WHITE 3.

- x. (1) See Intelligence Annex.

- (2) No planes will be fired upon by pers of 826th Amph Trac Bn unless directly attacked.

SECRET

(3) 743rd Ord will be located Right Flank BEACH WHITE 2, Left Flank BEACH WHITE 3 for de-waterproofing. All general purpose vehicles will report that point, (thru direction signs) en route to Assembly Area. Vehicles will not stop at any other point en route.

(4) All units will establish perimeter defense and maintain same at all times.

(5) NO FIRING IS TO BE DONE INSIDE OF PERIMETER ON ANY ENEMY AT NIGHT. KNIVES AND HAND TO HAND FIGHTING WILL BE EMPLOYED. Pers assigned guard duty by 533rd EB&SR will fire as directed.

(6) All units located within the SHORE PARTY defense perimeter will be prepared to turn out provisional rifle platoons immediately upon notice from the SHORE PARTY COMDR. These provisional rifle plats will consist of no less than forty (40) percent of the present strength including officers where ordered.

(7) IF BEACH IS UNTENABLE FOR ASSEMBLY AFTER LANDING INFANTRY, PLATS WILL MOVE TO FLANK AND ASSEMBLE IN GENERAL AREA OF LD. 1st Plat to go to right flank, 2nd and 3rd Plat to left flank and thence out to LD area. Above will be done only upon permission granted by this HQ.

(8) All plats will check individual FO's of RCT's with whom atchd for landing, for conditions, zones of action, initial use of plat for land movements.

(9) All Filipinos and civilians not carrying authenticated guerrilla passes will be disarmed. Civilian workers will be identified by Dog Tags with following stamped on it: "OXD & Number 10,001 to 20,000" for 43rd Inf Div. Civilians working with other divisions will have OXD and numbers assigned to that Div. Any civilians having OXD tag will not be allowed outside perimeter and will be disarmed.

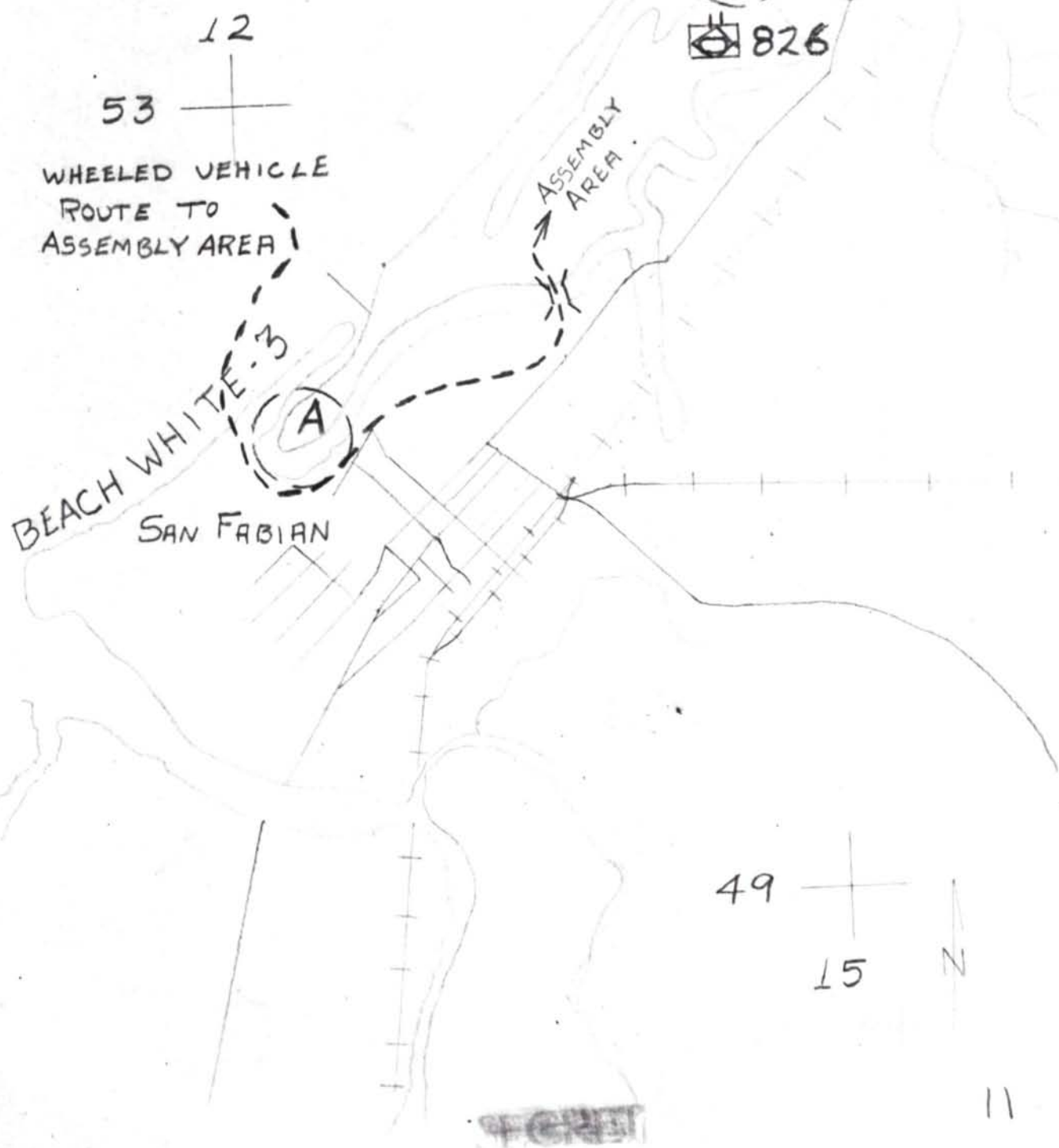
OVERLAY - FO-2

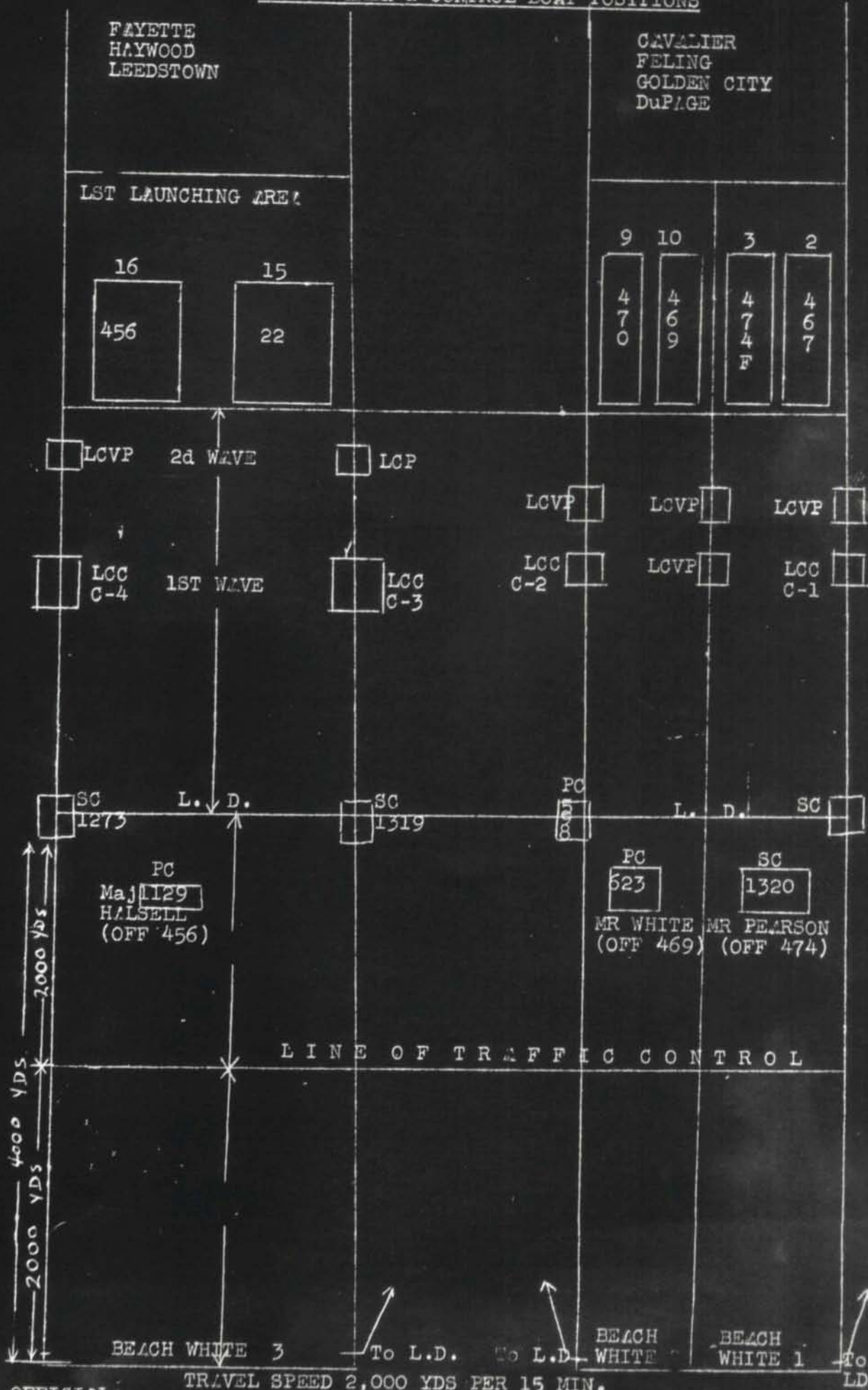

**Intelligence Annex to FO #2.**

**1. Summary of Enemy Situation.**

- a. See attached sketches, 1, 2, and 3.

**2. Essential Elements of Information.**

a. Location, disposition, strength and armament of enemy troops capable of bringing fire on beaches, the approach to beaches, or on Bn bivouac area.

b. Location of water obstacles and mines.

c. Location of land mines.

d. Location of road blocks or terrain obstacles en routes along beaches or en routes running inland from the beaches, this to include impassable dikes around fish ponds.

**3. Reconnaissance and Observation Missions.**

x. 1. All individuals having knowledge of the presence of enemy forces including aviation, naval and ground forces will submit such information at once by the speediest means available to the proper Headquarters. Platoons attached to combat teams will render these reports to the headquarters of the proper combat team. Units operating directly under this headquarters will render reports to Bn S-2.

2. Messages - Types, method of transmission, notification of threatened elements and message forms, see Div Intelligence SOP and extracts previously distributed.

**4. Measures for Handling Prisoners and Captured Documents.**

a. Prisoners of War will be properly tagged showing place, time and circumstances of capture and unit making capture. Platoons attached to combat teams will deliver POW as instructed by Combat Team Commanders. Units operating under this Hq will deliver POW without delay to Bn S-2. They will be allowed to keep all personal property except documents and weapons. Under no circumstances will troops fraternize, converse with, (except official business) or accept presents from POW. No food, water or cigarettes will be given to POW by any members of this organization.

b. All captured materiel is the property of the U. S. Gov't. All papers and articles bearing Japanese writing are to be considered documents. However obtained they will be transmitted immediately to this or other immediate higher Hq for transmission to the Div Language Section. If tagged with finder's name, orgn, and circumstances of finding the article may be returned to him when it is of no further military value.

**5. Maps and Photographs.**

- a. See attached sketches Nos. 1, 2, and 3.

**6. Counterintelligence.**

a. Classified documents in forward echelon will be kept to a minimum. Documents classified as Confidential or higher will not be taken to positions in advance of the Bn CP. Each CP or section will be prepared to destroy all classified papers immediately in event of imminent capture. One person on duty will at all times be designated to perform

this function. He will be supplied with necessary facilities and instructions and papers will be kept where he can speedily obtain them. In event of capture or compromise of SOI, codes or ciphers reports will immediately be made to next higher Headquarters.

b. Unit censors will review current censorship instructions including Div Intelligence SOP and USAFFE Cir #63 and will scrupulously enforce these regulations.

c. All individuals possessing cameras will submit them to Company Commanders for safe keeping not later than 25 Dec 44.

d. Prior to embarkation all equipment and other materiel will be checked by Company Commanders and Staff chiefs of sections to insure that only prescribed markings have been used and that articles bearing unit identification are not carried into forward areas. Personal letters and papers bearing the organization will be left in the rear echelon or will have the identification cut out.

e. All personnel will be warned to expect enemy agents mingling with the Philippine civilians. They will at all times be on their guard against disclosure of any military information including unit identification. All telephone conversations will proceed on the assumption that wires are being tapped.

f. Any personnel leaving the organization will be warned personally by his commanding officer against disclosing any information pertaining to future operations of this or any other organization.

g. Troops will be reminded frequently that in event of capture they will disclose only their NAME, RANK AND SERIAL NUMBER.

h. Incoming mail to be delivered to personnel operating near perimeter will have the unit designation and APO number cut off before leaving the Company Headquarters.

i. Maximum use will be made of camouflage nets and natural cover and camouflage material to gain protection from enemy aircraft and artillery.

j. Troops will take every advantage of cover and concealment compatible with the accomplishment of their mission. Fox holes will be at least four feet in depth and covered with coconut logs or heavy planking and earth.

k. Vehicles will be kept as well dispersed as conditions permit. Under no circumstances will several vehicles be bunched together.

l. All personnel are warned against any desecration of enemy dead.

m. Signs and countersigns.

- (1) Passwords as indicated below will be used during the operation.
- (2) Signs and countersigns will be used on the days of the week indicated in column 1 regardless of date.
- (3) Passwords become effective at 0700 on the day indicated for a 24 hour period.

Example: On any Wednesday the words "WINNIE WINKLE" will be used starting at 0700 on Wednesday. They will remain effective until 0700 on Thursday at which time "TILLIE TOILER" becomes effective for the next 24 hours.

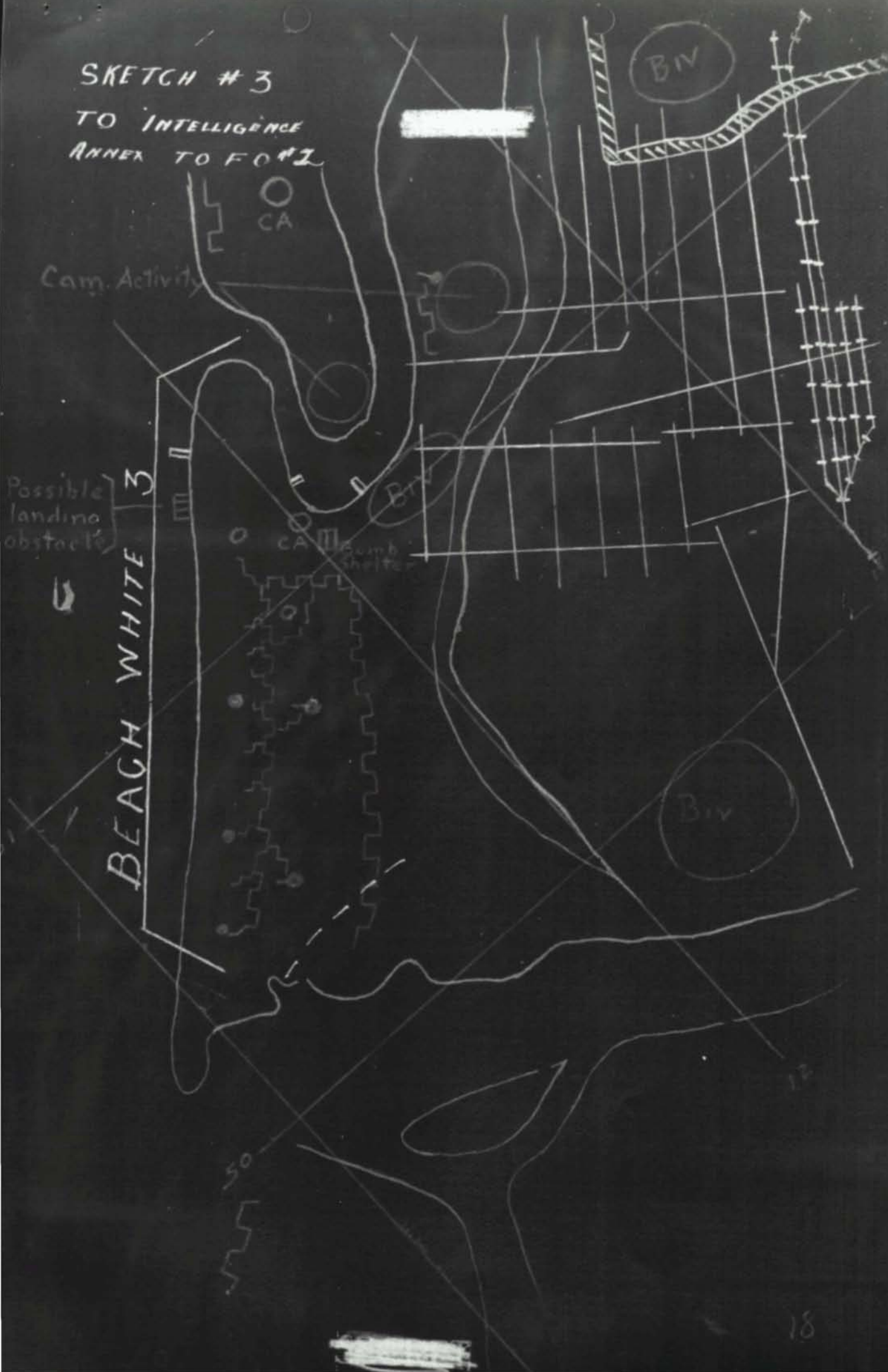

ADMINISTRATIVE ANNEX TO F.O. NO. 2

I. SUPPLY:

1. Class I

A. Rations:

To accompany Troops: 10 days emergency rations divided as follows: 1 "K", 1 "D", 1 "C" and 7 "10 in 1" (or an equal amount of "C" and "K" substitutes).

Above rations will be carried by troops in individual vehicles.

Class I dumps will be established S plus 3 for issues of supplemental issue 1/3 ration of coffee, sugar, jam, cheese, milk and canned meat.

Voyage rations will be drawn by the ship TQM and will be loaded on each ship.

B. Water:

Assault troops will carry two full canteens.

All available containers will be filled prior to unit departure from staging area.

There will be a limited water supply during the voyage. Water points will be established as soon as possible.

For individual Water Purification: 4 halazone tablets per canteen of water. If halazone is not available, water will be boiled.

2. Class II:

A. Clothings

All clothing and equipment will be carried by the individual soldier in their respective vehicle.

Waterproof bags will be used inside of duffle bag.

For Protective Clothing & Impregnation: See Medical Plan.

Remainder of baggage and Officers baggage will be carried by Company Supply and delivered with Organizational Equipment.

B. Cleaning and Preserving Materials:

15 days supply will be carried in Bn Supply.

15 day supply to follow in rear echelon Co Supply.

C. Chemical Warfare Supplies:

To be carried by all troops: Gas Mask; one (1) protective Cover and one (1) eyeshield, carried in Gas Mask Carrier.

Troops will carry Chemical Warfare Equipment until directed otherwise by C.G., 43d Division.

To Be Carried on Vehicle: One (1) Apparatus, Decon. 1½-Qt. filled with agent, and one (1) eyeshield.

All other T/E Chemical Warfare Equipment.

30 day expendable supplies will be carried by Co and Bn Supply.

T/E Protective Clothing will not be taken (This is not meant to include Imprgnated Clothing).

Gas Officers and Gas NCO's will perform the duties for which they have been trained.

Protection and preservation of Gas Masks will be observed. Frequent inspections will be made to insure their combat servicability.

D. Signal: See Signal Annex.

T/E Signal Equipment will be carried; in addition, 30 days supplies will be carried.

Re-supply at destination.

3. Class III:

A. Vehicles:

Driver will accompany each vehicle.

Vehicles will be serviced and waterproofed before loading.

Batteries will be fully charged before loading, and disconnected during voyage.

Will have chains on wheels.

Extra fuel cans will be filled.

Bn Maint. will carry all possible oil and grease.

Vehicles will be de-waterproofed immediately after landing, following instructions on de-waterproofing given by Bn Maintenance.

4. Class V:

A. Ammunition:

Combat units will carry two (2) units of fire.

Combat units will have three (3) units of fire in dump.

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ADM ANNEX TO FO #2 (cont)

Re-supply of ~~ammunition~~ to all units will be by requisition; Company and Sections will submit ~~ammunition~~ report to Bn S.O. and Bn S.O. will requisition same.

Time of Reports: 1800 as of 1700 daily.

Re-supply of ~~ammunition~~ will have priority over all other types of supply.

5. Misc Supply:

All command Vehicles will immediately be unloaded on arrival in bivouac area for use in hauling supplies.

Gasoline Supply will be through Bn S-4. Gas requests submitted submitted to Bn S-4 by companies.

~~Ammunition~~ Re-supply through Bn S-4.

Conservation of supplies will be enforced at all times.

Equipment will be guarded.

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APPENDIX NO. 1 TO ADMINISTRATIVE ANNEX No. 1 (Medical Plan)

1. Supply:

- a. Battalion Aid Station will carry:
  - (1) Medical Supplies for fifteen days. (15).
  - (2) Syrettes of Morphine, blood plasma, sets and atabrine to provide for unexpected emergencies.
- b. All LVT's will carry:
  - (1) Kit, First Aid, Motor Vehicle 24 Unit.
  - (2) Syrettes of Morphine, five (5).
- c. All First Aid Men will carry:
  - (1) Kit, Medical Private.
  - (2) Syrettes of Morphine, fifteen (15).
- d. All Personnel in the chain of evacuation are enjoined to adhere strictly to the rule of property exchange.

2. Evacuation:

- a. Bn. Aid Station will be established at "White Beach 3" in the vicinity of the Bn. C.P., and furnish medical aid for all personnel passing through.
- b. Casualties to be Evacuated to:
  - (1) Company "A", 263d Medical Bn. on "Beach White".
  - (2) Thru Inf. Bn's as attached until Bn has been assembled.

3. Reports:

- a. All Medical Department Reports will be submitted in accordance with the following directives: "Letter, Hq. Sixth Army, file AG 391.N 3, Subject: "Medical Department Reports", dated 22 June, 4 Aug., 30 June, 7 Sept and 18 Sept., 1944.

4. Sanitation & Hygeine:

Suppressive treatment of malaria consists of 1 gram (10 tablets) of atabrine per week will be given to each individual. Program calls for 3 tablets on each of 2 days (Monday & Wednesday) and 4 tablets on the third day (Friday). This will be accomplished by roster under supervision of a commissioned officer. Each individual will have 2 ~~stiff~~ suits fatigues, 1 pr legins, 6 pr socks and one blanket impregnated with Dimethyl Phthate.

Preparatory lectures will be given on Insect Control and Venereal Prophylaxis.

All other matters pertaining to sanitation according to S.O.P.

**I. Personnel:**

- (1) White and Green copies of Morning Reports of all units will be rendered to Bn Hq daily by 0900.

**F. Fiscal Matters:**

- (1) All units will prepare payrolls and vouchers to include two months (December & January). All payrolls will be signed prior to leaving Staging Area and delivered to the 43d Division Finance Office. Payment will be made as the tactical situation permits after 31 January 1945.

- (2) Unit funds will be turned in to S-1 prior to 23 Dec 44.

SIGNAL ANNEX TO FO #2.

1. Radio Communication.

- a. Radio silence will prevail until the line of departure has been crossed.
- b. SOP Battalion nets as prescribed in current SOI to be used.
- c. Additional stations as needed will be on order of this Headquarters.
- d. Due to limited number of frequencies all messages must be as brief as possible.
- e. Codes, ciphers and authentication as prescribed in current SOI & SOP.

2. Radio Assault Wave Control.

- a. Wave Commanders will be equipped with SCR-508 and will monitor the assault wave control frequency of 27.3M/C, and their prescribed platoon frequency.
- b. All commands from Navy control boats will be on 27.3M/C and necessary instructions to individual tractors of each wave will be made by the Wave Commander over the regular platoon channel.
- c. Navy Control Boats will call specific vehicles using their Navy vehicle numbers. Wave commander will be responsible for relaying Navy commands to individual vehicles on platoon channels.

3. Visual Signalling.

- a. Semaphore signalling - Bn SOP & current SOI.
- b. Blinkers - Bn SOP.
- c. Pyrotechnics - use current SOI.
- d. Panels AP 50A - use current SOI.

4. General

- a. Signal Equipment will be checked H minus two. Do not transmit.
- b. Red and Tank Alerts will be given in the clear and preceded by the word "FLASH", as: "FLASH - Enemy planes bearing from SAN FABIAN, (giving direction of flight and range)."
- c. Local time will be "I" time.

5. Map Template Code.

- a. Map Template M-2 will be used to encode map coordinates.
- b. Enemy positions will be sent in the clear.
- c. The following points of origin will be used on the "Central Luzon Area 1/50,000 scale map."
  - (a) Origin point V at Anonang. Line V - IV through INLAMBO.
  - (b) Origin point I at Guesang. Line I - III through CABILAQAN.
  - (c) Origin point V at Talegteg. Line V - VIII through INOMAN.
- d. New points of origin on different maps may be issued on order from this Headquarters.
- e. Due to the large area covered simultaneously any of the three reference points may be used, that is whichever covers the point to be designated.
- f. The reference point used must be included in the message to insure correct decoding; for instance - "My position is B 1/50,000 R 22". In the above message "B" indicates that Origin Point I is placed over reference point Guesang, so that line I - III passes through Cabilacan. 1/50,000 indicates that the map CENTRAL LUZON AREA 1/50,000 is being used and indicates the square on Map Template M-2 and 22 indicates the sub-square in which the originator of the message is located in.
