## APPENDIX I - Action Against Enemy, Reports After/After Action Reports.

Report of Operations - Month of December 1944

Dec. 1, 1944 - Battalion attached 9th Inf. Div.  
 Bn. (less Co. C.) in assembly area vicinity Robertville, Belgium. During the day Co. C. relieved from attachment 47th CT vicinity Nohberg, Germany moved to Bn. assembly area. Co. B. attached to 60th CT moved from Bn. Assembly area to vicinity of Rotgen, Germany, one platoon occupied defensive positions in vicinity of Mutzenich, Germany.

No enemy contact reported.

M-10's Operational - 34

Dec. 2, 1944 - Bn. (less Co. B.) continued maintenance and training in assembly area vicinity Robertville, Belgium.

B Company - No Change.

No enemy contact reported.

M-10's Operational - 33

Dec. 3 & 4, 1944 - No Change.

Dec. 5, 1944 - Bn. (less Co's A & B) remained in assembly area vicinity Robertville, Belgium.

Co. A. attached 39th Inf. CT moved from vicinity Robertville, Belgium to vicinity of Volkenrath, Germany. 2nd Pltn. Co. A. moved out with 2nd Bn. 39th Inf.

Co. B attached 60th CT - No Change.

No enemy contact reported.

M-10's Operational - 34

Dec. 6, 1944 - Bn. (less Co's A, B & C) moved to Eschweiler, Germany.

Co. A. attached 39th CT located vic Volkenrath, Germany, 2nd pltn Co. A. in support 2nd Bn. 39th Inf. in Jungersdorf, Germany.

Co. B. stchd 60th CT moved from Rotgen and Mutzenich,

Germany to Company assembly area vicinity Nohberg, Germany.

Co. C. attached in place at Robertville, Belgium to 47th CT scheduled to move South of Eschweiler on Dec. 7, 1944.

No enemy contact reported.

M-10's Operational - 34

Dec. 7, 1944 - Bn. (less Co. C) - No Change.

Bn. CO met with Div. Comdr. for the purpose of making recommendations for the employment of TV's during the next offensive action. Following this discussion, C.O. conferred with gun company Commanders, making detailed plans for execution by respective companies, including the employment of the Reconnaissance platoons supporting them during the operation.

Co. C. motor marched with 47th CT from Robertville, Belgium to assembly area South of Eschweiler, Germany. 2nd platoon moved under cover of darkness to A.T. positions in Luchem, Germany.

## 2) - Report of Operations - Month of December 1944

Dec. 8, 1944 - No change in attachments or locations. All Companies engaged in perfecting and coordinating their part of the Div. plan for offensive action to be taken when ordered, i.e., A thrust by 3rd Armd. Div. thru the towns of Obergeich, Geich, Lichten, Mariawiller-Doven followed by 60th CT to consolidate, "mop up", and hold the gains as they were taken. 47th Inf. to commit one battalion and advance East from Lichem to fill a gap that would occur between the right flank of the 104th Div. and the left flank of the 60th CT. 39th CT w/attachments to attack simultaneously with armor, seize the town D'horn, Schlich and Merode, keeping abreast of the attack of the 60th CT and securing the Div. right flank until vulnerability was alleviated by the advance of the 83rd Div.

No offensive action taken - moderate enemy activity thru-out the day.

Dec. 9, 1944 - No change in attachments or positions.

Co. A - Platoons moved to positions of readiness. Reconnaissance of routes and positions continued by all Companies.

Light enemy activity reported, mostly artillery fire with some enemy air activity and occasional direct fire from enemy held positions on high ground.

M-10's Operational - 33

Dec. 10, 1944 - No change in missions or attachments.

1st Pltn. Co. A. supported 1st Bn. 39th Inf. with direct fire in a feint and patrol activity toward Merode, platoon also covered the advance of the 2nd Bn. 39th Inf. with flanking fire across their front while they advanced from Jungersdorf to D'horn. 2nd platoon supported the advance of the 2nd Bn. to D'horn from direct fire positions in Jungersdorf. 3rd platoon moved from reserve positions Southwest of Jungersdorf along main axis of advance to the North, then Southeast and took up direct support of the 2nd Bn. in D'horn. 2nd platoon assumed reserve status.

Co. B - 1st Platoon moved to Dichtz supporting advance of infantry and armor of 1st Bn. 60th CT. 2nd platoon moved to A.T. positions in Obergeich giving close support to the 2nd Bn. 3rd platoon remained in position of readiness in Langersache ready to move on call as the situation developed.

Co. C - 1st platoon (less 3 guns) remained in reserve position vicinity Co. CP. 2nd platoon occupied A.T. positions in Lichem. 3rd platoon delivered indirect fire in support of 84th P.A. Bn. expending 968 rds. HERC on town of Konzendorf for the purpose of discouraging enemy activity of any consequence from that point during execution of the Division plan. Platoon computer operated directly from 84th FA Bn. FDC.

## Report of Operations - Month of December 1944

Dec. 11, 1944 - A Co. - 1st platoon continued to support the attack of the 1st Bn. 39th Inf. on Merode moving behind the advance of the Infantry to A.T. positions in the town gaining protection from piles of rubble and heavily constructed buildings. 2nd platoon moved to A.T. positions in D'horn maintaining a reserve status and being prepared to assist in repelling possible counter-thrust. 3rd platoon moved behind attack of 2nd Bn. 39th Inf., supporting the advance whenever possible, occupied A.T. positions in town of Schlich covering approaches generally from South and Southeast.

B Co. - 1st platoon occupied A.T. positions in Echtr., encountered considerable enemy artillery fire but no close contact with enemy armor. 2nd platoon held A.T. positions in Obergeich under relatively the same conditions. 3rd platoon moved behind infantry advance towards Rauthausen, occupied and held A.T. positions closely supporting infantry.

C Co. - 1st platoon (less 3 guns - 2 in Ord., 1 in Bn. Maint.) remained in reserve position. 2nd platoon from positions near Eastern edge of Luchem supported advance of 1st Bn. 47th Inf. as they moved forward between 60th CT and the 104th Inf. Div. (tied in with A.T. defense of 692nd T.D. Bn. on the left). 3rd pltn continued to occupy indirect fire positions in support of 34th F.A. Bn. vicinity of Luchem, Germany.

Recon. Co. - One section, Pioneer Platoon captured 3 Prisoners and killed 1 enemy while sweeping road of mines for 1st platoon Co. A. in advance on Merode.

1 1/4 T truck destroyed by enemy artillery fire.

Dec. 12, 1944 - A Co. - 1st Platoon fired 7 rds APC, 42 rds HE in support of attack by 1st Bn. 39th CT against enemy strong points, also shot down one (1) ME 109 with concentrated 50 Cal. M/G fire. 2nd Pltn remained in reserve positions in D'horn. 3rd platoon remained in A.T. positions at Schlich. 1st and 3rd platoons both waiting for mines to be removed before advancing.

B Co. - 1st platoon position of readiness in Echtr., waiting to move to Noven. 2nd platoon moved thru Echtr. to area immediately West of Mariawiller-Noven behind advance of 2nd Bn. 60th Inf. 3rd platoon held A.T. positions S.W. of Konrendorf.

C Co. - 1st platoon relieved 3rd platoon from indirect fire positions vicinity Luchem attached to 34th F.A. Bn. 2nd platoon attached 1st Bn. 47th Inf. maintained overwatching A.T. positions in Luchem. 3rd platoon attached 1st Bn. 60th Inf. and moved to A.T. positions in Echtr. and Konrendorf.

Recon Co. - Recon platoons were engaged in continuation of SOP route, position and visual reconnaissance. Pioneer section attached to Co. A. engaged in sweeping routes for destroyers.




