## APPENDIX I - Action Against Enemy, Reports After/After Action Reports.

Report of Operations - Month of October 1944

Oct. 1, 1944 - Battalion attached 9th Inf. Div. under 9th Div. Arty.  
Co. A. less 1st Pltn. attached 39th Inf. Regt. vicinity Lammersdorf, Germany.  
Co. B. less 2nd Pltn. attached to TF TINCHEK - 1 section employed on road block, remainder of Company in reserve (TF TINCHEK consisted of 2nd Bn. 60th Inf. Regt., 9th Recon. Troop, 1 platoon Engineers, 1 Company Light Tanks, Co. "B", 899th T.D. Bn. (less 1 platoon), Recon. Company, 899th T. D. Bn. (less 3 Recon. Sections), 1 Battery 34th P.A. (155 mm How.), 1 battery 60th P.A. (105 mm How.) Mission to occupy and hold line extending generally from road inter-section, midway between Monschau and Hofen, Germany, to line on right flank of 39th Inf. Regt. located then, South and West of Lammersdorf, Germany. TFT was originally organized September 21st, 1944.

Co. C. attached 47th Inf. Regt. - 2 platoons giving direct support to Infantry - 1 platoon in indirect fire position, location - Vicht and Schevenhutte, Germany.

TF GOURLEY, consisting of 1 Platoon Co. A., 2nd Platoon Co. B., with command and administrative personnel, attached 60th Inf. Platoons in A.T. positions giving close protection to infantry front lines. TF GOURLEY was formed as result of need for provisional company to give close support to Infantry Regiments, and was formed on September 14, 1944.

Reconnaissance Co. - 1 Recon. section attached Co. A., 1 Recon. section attached Co. C., 1 Recon. section attached TFG., balance of company attached to TF TINCHEK, performing normal missions, SOP Reconnaissance.

Headquarters Co. under Battalion control continued maintenance and administration for line companies and provisional Task Forces.

M-10's Operational - 34 - 2 replacements not yet received.

Enemy Materiel Destroyed - Unknown.

Ammunition Expended - 11 rds. H.E.

4th. Cavalry Group relieved elements of TFT in North and Central part of previously mentioned sector, Infantry elements South of Monschau, and personnel on road block awaited relief following day.

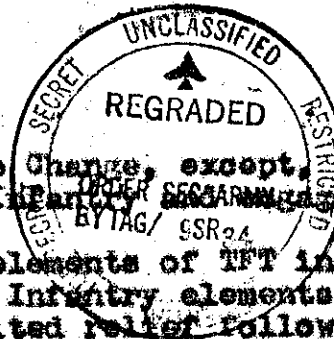

Oct. 3, 1944 - Missions and attachments - No Change, except, TF TINGLER dissolved. Company B less 2nd Pltn. occupied indirect fire positions N.E. of Rotgen, Germany, in direct support of 981st F.A. Bn.

1st Pltn. Co. C fired 41 rds. indirect fire at gun and troops emplacements - results observed and appeared to be excellent.

B Co. less 2nd Pltn. remained in indirect fire position in vicinity Rotgen, Germany in support of 981st F. A. Bn.

C Co. remained attached 47th Inf. 2nd and 3rd Pltns. in A.T. positions - 1 platoon in indirect fire position.

TFG remained attached 60th Inf. Regt. S.E. of Zweifall.

Recon. Co. less 3 sections performed SCF Reconnaissance under Battalion control.

Headquarters Co. continued normal maintenance and administrative duties.

Battalion OP moved to Zweifall, Germany.

Oct. 6, 1944 - Co. A. less 1st Pltn. moved behind attack of 39th Inf. in Easterly direction. Positions near Germeter, Germany received some artillery and mortar fire. No rounds fired owing to dense growth of woods and soggy condition of ground, rendering track vehicles practically road bound. Occupied A.T. positions on likely avenues of enemy armored approach.

Co. B. less 2nd Pltn. continuing support of 981st F.A. Bn. fired 75 rds. indirect fire and 31 registration.

Co. C. in A.T. positions supporting 47th Inf. Regt.

TFG - 1st Pltn. Co. A. fired 25 rds. H.E. and 15 APG at pill boxes. Fortifications proved extremely well built and firing at aperatures was apparently the only way penetration could be obtained.

(3) - Report of Operations - Month of October 1944.Oct. 6, 1944 (Cont'd.)

Platoon Leader discovered enemy dug in outside and in strategic locations around pill boxes in defensive positions. Weapons found included an 8.8 cm, two wheeled, recoilless, towed Anti-Tank gun, Panzerfaust and Bazooka teams. Platoon sprayed area thoroughly with H.E. fuze quick, firing into trees and shrubs to get an air-burst effect, which appeared to be the approved solution for rendering the pill boxes subject to capture by Infantry.

All positions generally quiet except for a rather slow continuous exchange of artillery and mortar fire with sporadic outbursts of small arms through-out the front. Weather continued wet, ground soggy and unsuitable for movement for track vehicles.

Ground observation very limited due to fog in and East of Hurtgen Forest, so that fire delivered was from map data with correction estimated from partial registration applied. Mission - harassing and interdiction.

TFG - 2nd Pltn. Co. B. moved East and South in support of 60th Inf. Regt. in rear of point of attack to clear out German fortifications and dug in positions. 1st Pltn. Co. A. in position to support attack on right flank of Regiment or break-thru of front line positions.

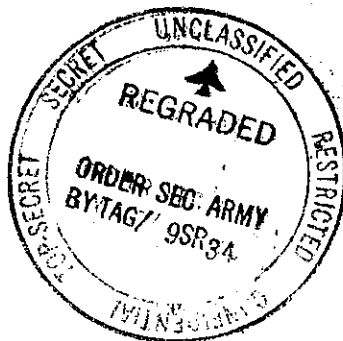

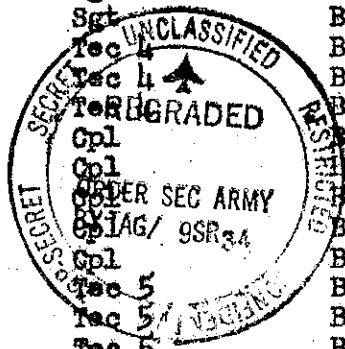
