The Pratte family moved to town shortly after the twins were born and has lived here

ever since ever since.
Herb enlisted in the RI
National Guard in 1940. When
the war began, he remained in
the Army, starting as an
enlisted man and ending as an officer, until his honorable discharge was granted in December 1945.

He became an officer in 1942 after attending an officer training school in Texas. A year later he was promoted again and sent to the European War Theater as part of the 628th Tank Destroyer Battalion, which made the initial entry into Cormotor.

Mr Pratte took part in four major campaigns during which he was awarded a presidential unit citation, the Bronze Star, and Purple Heart with a cluster the being wounded twice in

being wounded twice in battle. The president of Warren High School's Alumni Assoc in 1939, also served as commander of the Stevens-Laroche-Pratte Post 122, Veterans of Foreign

Wars in 1946. In an effort to build the post treasury, he took four hundred dollars from his personal ac-count for four ringside seats to the Joe Louis-Billy Conn fight at Madison Square Garden in New York Cibr.
