- (1) Seventy two (72) enlisted replacements were received between 9 January 1943 and 8 February 1943.
- (2) Unit was reorganized 21 May 1943 under T/O 18-25, dated 27 January 1943.
- (3) Two hundred twenty one (221) overstrength enlisted men resulting from reorganization were transferred to Basic Unit Training Center, Tank Destroyer Center, North Camp Hood, Texas, on 19 June 1943.

  - b. Length of daily march: 205 miles.
  - c. Points between which marched and dates: Camp McCoy, Wisconsin to Anoka, Minnesota, 10 August 1943. Anoka, Minnesota to Fargo, North Dakota, 11 August 1943. Fargo, North Dakota to Rugby, North Dakota, 12 August 1943. Rugby, North Dakota to Minot, North Dakota 13 August 1943.
  - d. Conditions of roads and weather: Roads improved; Weather warm.
  - e. Remarks: None.
4. Return March to Camp McCoy, Wisconsin.
  - a. Purpose: Return from grain harvesting to permanent station.
  - b. Length of daily march: 205 miles.
  - c. Points between which marched and dates: Minot, North Dakota to Fargo, North Dakota, 17 September 1943. Fargo, North Dakota to Anoka, Minnesota, 18 September 1943. Anoka, Minnesota to Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, 19 September 1943.
