HISTORICAL REGORD OF 609 TANK DESTROYER BATTALION FOR PERIOD 31 DECEMBER 1944 TO 13 MOVEMBER 1945

A. Original Unit: No change.

B. Changes in Organization:

1. 113 November 1945-Battalion inactivated in accordance with Go 22 30th HQ & HQ Det, ST 2d Army, Camp Breckin-ridge, Ky.

C. Stations (permanent or temporary):

ETO-1 January 1945 to 50 August 1945

Camp Shanks, NY-7 September 1945 to 8 September 1945

Camp Breckingidge, Ky.-8 September 1945 to end of period.

D. Marches:

1. March to rejoin 10th Armd Div after being relieved from operational control of XII Corps. Battalion moved from vic RODENBOURG, LUXEMBOURG (P965221) at 1330, 11 January 1945, to vic COLLIGNY, FRANCE (U970565); the weather was threatening snow, the sky was overcast, and the roads were covered with ice and very slippery. The march was made without incident.

2. March to rejoin the 3rd Cav. Gp. after being relieved from attachment to 16th Cav. Gp. Battalion left WIRSCHWEILER, GERMANY (1595295) at 2130, 22 March 1945, and moved by way of MERZIG, GERMANY (Q2094) and BOUZANVILLE, FRANCE (Q1277) to SAARLAUTERN, GERMANY (Q285798), closing at 0920, 23 March 1945. The weather was clear, sunmy, and cool; the roads were hard surfaced and dusty. The march was made without incident.

3. The battalich marched from SAARLAUTERN, GERMANY, to NEUSTADT (R2983) to rejoin 10th Armd Div. Unit left at 0600, 24 March 1945, and closed at 1430. Weather clear and sunny, roads good.

4. The majority of marches in the ETO were not made by the battalion as a unit but by the companies attached to combat commands of the loth Armd Div; therefore it is difficult to put them down here. The after action reports of the battalion contain records of all the marches made by any units of the battalion.

E. Campaigns:

 Battalion participated in the ARDENNES CAMPAIGN from 1 January 1945 until 18 January 1945 (Authority: Ltr. 7th Army AG 200-6/BPA, 25 June 1945). Battalion was attached to 10th Armd Div (Co. A with CCA, Co. C with CCB, Bn (-) with CCR), whose mission was to stop the German break-through at the south flank of the Ardennes Bulge and to protect Luxembourg City.

2. Battalion participated in the RHINELAND CAMPAIGN from 18 January 1945 until 21 March 1945 (Authority: Ltr.,

7th Army AG 200-6/BPA, 26 June 1945).

3. Battalion participated in CAMPAIGN OF CENTRAL EUROPE from 22 March 1945 until 11 May 1945 (Authority: Ltr., 7th Army, A G 200-6/ BPA, 27 June 1945).

F. Battles:

- 1. BASTOGNE—Battle took place in the vic of BASTOGNE,
 BELGIUM (P5558) from 1 January 1945 until 18 January
 1985 and was part of the ARDENNES CAMPAIGN. Co. C
 (plus 2nd Rcn. Platoeneless 1st Platoon) was attached
 to CCB, 10th Armd Div, with its platoons supporting
 units of the 101st Airborne Division. The res ult of
 the battle was that the vital road center of BASTOGNE
 was kept from the enemy. The troops from the battalion
 involved received the Presidential Citation for the
 BASTOGNE Battle.
- 2. TRIER-Battle took place along approaches to TRIER from the SAAR RIVER from 25 February 1945, when initial movement across the SAAR RIVER was made by 1st Plat. Co. B on rafts, until the battalion closed in TRIER when Bn CP moved into city at 1745, 3 March 1985. Battalion was attached to 10th Armd Div (Co. A with CCB, Co. B with CCA, Co. C with CCR and 376 Inf Regt, 94th Inf Div.) Results of the battle were that the SAAR RIVER was crossed, a large portion of the Siegfried Line was breached, the city of TRIER was taken, and junction was made with 76th Div, 3rd Army, along the MOSELLE RIVER north of TRIER.
- 3. CRAILSHEIM—Battle took place north of CRAILSHEIM (S (S7066) GERMANY and in and around the town itself from 6 April 1945 until 10 April 1945. The battalion was attached to the 10th Armd Div (Co. A with CCB, Co. B with CCA, and the remainder of the unit with CCR). The result of the battle was that an unknown number of enemy were killed, wounded, and captured; an unestimated amount of enemy material was destroyed; but the Division had to withdraw from the CRAILSHEIM area without gaining any strategic advantage.
