

Killed in Action



Cpl. Frank Paneblanco, son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Paneblanco of 615 West Oterman street, was killed in action in France on November 11, according to a telegram from the War Department received by his parents Thursday. The young Greensburg soldier joined the armed forces on March 27, 1942 and trained at Pine Camp, N. J., Camp Hood and Camp Maxey, Texas with a tank destroyer unit and was serving in that branch with General Patton's army when he was killed.

Cpl. Paneblanco came to Greensburg from Italy with other members of his family in 1930. For a time, he was employed at the Petrarca store in Derry. He also worked for Bisignani and Marzani, who conducted tailor shops in Greensburg.

In addition to his parents, four sisters and two brothers, all at home survive. They are: Angeline, Rosaline, Ellen and Frances and Fred and Joseph.
