Haschke, who was killed in action March 3, in Germany.

Cpl. Haschke was the Frank Haschke of Cedar Rapids. The Rev. Father Vermuelen of-

ficiated at the requiem high mass. Honorably discharged service men and members of the American Legion were in attendance with Legionnaires as flag-bearers. lowing the services the national anthem was sung and tape

sounded.

Abert F. Haschke was born Jan. 22, 1908, one, of a set of twins at Cedar Rapids, He attended school St. Anthony's. Following his school days he helped his father on the farm for a few years. Then Albert with his twin brother, Adolph,

farmed what is known as the Kleve ranch. He was working in a copper mine in Arizona when called to the colors. He was inducted for military service on April 4, 1942, going over-
