#### 7. Bettles:

Battalion received orders delivered by Majer WALKER, XII Corps, to move from vicinity to VALDECIE to vicinity MAPTAL to help repel attack launched by a reported two passer divisions in vicinity MORTAIN. Battalion alerted for move and pressed IP at 2030 hours, 7 August. Route of March was changed by MP's and GP group of Battalion was caught in air bombardment and strafing at AVRANCHES at 0030 hours, 8 August. Suffered one death and three casualties with less of one (1) 1/4 ton and one (1) motorcycle, first combat losses of unit.

Battalien was attached to XX Corps and immediately upon arrival at NAFTAL were ordered to proceed to an area 3 miles South of VITRE. Arrived at that point at 1145 hours after a trip of 130 miles from original bivouso area. At 1440 hours, 8 August received orders to proceed to area vicinity CRAUN and report to CG, 80th Infantry Division at CRAUN. Battalien moved out at 1950 hours and closed in new bivouse area at 2200 hours.

On 9th August at 0745 hours, Battalien received orders to proceed to area of HEAU SOLETL, 18 miles East of LAVAL, and also informed that we were now attached to XV Gorps. Battalien cleared IP at 1210 hours and closed in new bivouse at 1742 hours and staff reported to 80th Infantry Division. At 2145 hours that evening three German prisoners of the 17th Reserve Panser Division were brought into CP by french civilians. They were Lt. ERICH HUTT, 8gt. Helst Harms, and Pvt. Paul Melser. Prisoners were picked up by French at 2000 hours at farm 4 km. east of SAZOUGES.

At 2245 hours, B Company was ordered to report to 518th combat team with purpose of seizing B/RON and C Company ordered to 517th combat team with objective of seizing St. SUZANNE. Soth towns liberated. B Company was them ordered to move to vicinity SILLE LB GUILLIAME.

At 2040 hours, 10 August Battalion-mimus left with 319th combat team for assembly area in vicinity CHASSEILE. Closed in new area at 0210 hours, 11 August. Companies were all attached to respective combat teams. Forward CP meved to area 1/2 mile east of BOHEZ, closed in area 1725 hours. "A" Company took up indirect fire positions vicinity TEMMIE\_ROUEZ, tie in with Division Artillery survey.

2000 hours, 12 August, 8 and C Companies were relieved from assignment to 518th and 517th combat teams respectively.

August \$ 15, at 0700 hours orders were received from CG, 80th Inf. Division, to move in three columns north, destroying hostile forces encountered to an area vicinity of SECS.



Company A took middle route with Division Command group. B and C Companies advanced on the Eastern route. B, C and Battalion CP group made excellent progress. Just west of ALEHCON, the 2nd French Armored Division and the 90th Infantry Division crossed in front of column. Column was ordered to give priority to other two units and Battalion assembled in an area just NW of ALEHCON. At 1145, 14 August received orders to go to an assembly area 1.5 km. west of St. MORS DU DESERTES.

At 0200 hours, 15 August, received word of attachment to 8th Corps. Order also alerted Battalien for movement to area south of JUHLAIMS at 0630 hours. Gressed IP at 0848, arrived at 80th Division GP south of JUHLAIMS at 1148 hours. Commendation received from Division G-3 on Battalion movement. At 1780 hours received word of attachment to 3rd Army reserve from 8th Corps. Battalien alerted for movement to new assembly area at 1840 hours. Cleared IP at 2040 hours, arrived in assembly area morth of EVROR at 2226 hours. Companies received Infantry units of 80th Division who are to ride on our transportation. Battalien placed on 4 hour alert status, 16 August for movement to assembly area SW of ORLEANS.

Received amendment to orders of August 16 at 0345 hours, 17 August. Battalion to move to area 5 miles NW of SERS, H hour at 0300 hours. Battalien closed at 1130 hours. At 1700 hours received oral orders from CG, 80th Infantry Division, to attack with 518th combat team to seize high ground East of ARGENTAN, then high ground to NE. 610th attached to 318th. Two Companies to protect artillery and take care of tank attack thru ARGENTAN to SE and from NE into our positions. Direct fire possibilities to east of town. Orders confirmed by FO #6, 80th Division, and at 1950 hours companies moved out on their mission. CP group moved out and closed in new bivouse area with 80th Division CP, one mile west of ALMENECHES at 2330 hours. "A" Company given mission of supporting Division Artillery by indirect fire. "C" Company attached to 518th combat team for attack. "B" Company supporting 518th combat team in Corps Reserve. Division is attached to 1st Previsional Corps for the attack.

Enemy forces are trapped in a pocket between British forces breaking out of CAEN, 2nd French Armored and 1st Army on our left, and 90th Division on our right. Recape route is narrow gap existing between FALAISE and ARGENTAN. Poles fighting with the British were reported at TRUN at 1400 hours, 18 August.

Attacking forces of 80th Division received heavy automatic weapons fire and tank thrusts. Advance limited to main road leading east from AR-GENTAN.

On 19th August, 518th combat team launched attack on Division objective NE of ARGENTAN. Objective was not reached and 2nd and 5rd Battalion dug in. At 1755 hours, 517th with "C" Company, 610th TD Battalion attached, passed through 518th and launched attack. At 2500 hours it was stepped and dug in and ordered to resume attack at 0700 hours, 20 August. At 0900 hours, 19 August, forward CP of Battalion advanced to position in vicinity of Hill #171. Battalion commander concerned with getting elements of B Company across river at unimproved ford. Some elements succeeded in getting across without much trouble. Reported knocking out 5 MK VI tanks while elements of C Company knocked out 2-88mm 3P guns. The forward CP was taken under fire by enemy and Lt. Col. Herold, Majer Greenhaw, T/Sgt. Senger, S/Sgt. Dreissel, Tec/5 Lingo were injured by enemy fire at 2030 hrs.

All easualties were evacuated. Word was received that Lt. Col. Herold died of wounds received at 0130 hours, 20 August.

During the night of 19th, 20th August, "A" Company registered on house occupied by Germans and subsequently fired approximately 700 rounds, HE in indirect fire mission—harassing fires. At 0835 hours, 20 August, 3rd platoon "C" Company reported engaging tanks on their front. At that time, they had accounted for four (4) unidentified enemy tanks. "C" Company moved forward with 317th combat team occupying objective morth of ARGENTAN and disposed company commanding all reads leading into town. Little activity was reported except Infantry patrols containing small pockets of enemy remaining in area. "B" Company with 318th combat team occupied town of CAENNES and also holding ARGERTAN. Some confusion occurred in our command by passage of lines of 317th and 318th combat teams. Our Companies were not sure at all times just who they were supporting.

21st of August was relatively quiet with mopping up operations and Division organizing into an assembly area assigned to V Corps units. The V Corps took over from the 1st Provisional Corps during the battle and Division plus attached troops fought engagement as 1st Army troops. At 1800 hours, 21 August, the sommand over the area of the 80th Division north of ARGUNTAN-EXMES read passed to the British. Battle was over and Division began assembling, completing operation at 0130 hours, 22 August.

On the 24th August, Battalien in conjunction with combat teams of the Division went through a re-enactment of phases of the battle to coordinate the actions of tanks, TD'S and Infantry, illustrating the limitations and capabilities of each to the other arms.

Battalion was relieved from attachment to V Corps, 1st Army and attached to VII Corps, 3rd Army. At 1445 hours, 36 August, Battalien departed from assembly area in vicinity of ALMSNECHES enroute to new assembly area in vicinity ST FLAVY. Battalion closed in new area two miles east of ST FLAVY at 1900 hours, 27 August. Distance traveled: 347 miles. No accidents, no casualties, no loss of equipment.

Battalien in general support of 80th Infantry Division. "A" Company with S18th combat team on left of Division some, "G" Company in support of 317th combat team on right of Division some. Remainder of Battalion in reserve.
"A" and G Companies to pay particular attention to Division left flank.
Early the morning of the 28th, the Companies moved to join respective combat teams. All bridges up to MERY-SUR-SEINE have been reported blown, but fords are passable. Many of the roads are reported mined. At 1850 hours, the 28th August, the Battalion CP moved to new area 1-1/4 miles NE of VILLESEREUS, arriving there at 2200 hours. Fords immediately behind the column were attacked by air. As of midnight the 28th, the Battalion was disposed as follows: "A" Company with 518th combat team in vicinity of MATOUGES, "C" Company with 517th combat team in position in vicinity of ECURY\_SUR\_COHLE, and "B" Company continued in reserve with positions in vicinity 2 miles SE of highway from MATOUGES. Rear echelon 6-1/4 mile SN of Battalien CP.

On August 29, at 0745, "G" Company reported they were to attack JALON at 0800 hours. "A" Company reported they were advancing 5,000 yards morth of NATOUGES, "B" Company has been assigned new mission of direct support of 319th combat team to establish a bridgehead across MARME River at CHALONS, At 1300 hours, report was received that CHALON-SUR-MARKE had been taken at 0900 hours that morning. Companies were ordered to continue support of their combat teams. Results of day, no casualties, no loss of equipment, 9 prisoners captured, 10 rounds HE fired, 2 MG mosts destroyed by "A" Company.

August 30, 1944: "A" Company continued in direct support of the 518th combat team with positions as follows: CP and one platoom at LIV-1, one platoon at BCUY, one platoon at LES GRANDES LOGUES. "C" Company to continue same mission with 518th combat team. Company CP and two platoons were 1-1/2 miles north of ST ETIENNE. One platoon at L'EPINE. Sattalion CP moved to vicinity of LO VELUTE. "B" Company established road blocks as follows: One section at AURRIVE, one section at SULPPES, one section at AUVE, one section at LA PRESEE, and one platoon was in reserve with 319th combat team. Results of days Tem prisoners outpured by "A" Company.

At 0400 hours, 31 August FO #10 was received from 80th Infantry Division. Division to advance east on three routes at 0700 hours to seize BAR-LE-BUC, COMMERCY, and prepare for action toward ST THISL or to the east. "C" Company with 317th combat team on Route #2, "A" Company with 318th combat team on Route #3, "B" Company under Battalion control to follow route of 317th combat team. Companies moved out at 0700 hours as planned and joined respective combat teams. At 1500 hours, "B" Company reported that they were being held up by 85mm fire in vicinity of NCI DISLEVAL. The Battalion CP left with rear CP of Division at 2200 hours. At 2400 hours all Companies were in position. "B" Company in vicinity of RAHONT, "A" Company in vicinity of JEMISE, "C" Company in vicinity MEMILAUX. The 1st Section, 2nd plateon (Rom. plt.) reported fire 6 rounds 57mm RE at enemy gun positions. Battalion CP closed in new position in vicinity LAHEY CALRT at 0400 hours, lut September after passing through two villages macked by 85 troops.

At 0925, 1 September, "B" Company reported its objective as FT DELIGHTILLS, while "A" Company was one mile SH of COMMIRCY. "C" Company was 1/2 mile north of HUMORT. At 1650 hours, the CP left LAHAY COURT for new lecation in vicinity COMMERCY. "A" Company was proceeding on Route #5 with 518th combat team. "B" Company had 2nd platoon and CP in vicinity COURCELLS and one platoon with 5rd Battalion, 317th combat team across MEUSE River. "G" Company with two platoons and CP one wile east of MEMIL, one platoon with let Battalion, 517th combat team in vicinity WECGAN. The Sattalion CF closed in bivouse area in vicinity COMMERCY at 2130 hours. Disposition of Battalion as of 2400, 1 September was; "A" Company in vicinity CHIONVILLE, "B" Company in vicinity WAR BOTTE, "C" Company mims one platoon in vicinity ST IGNASSY, Eq. During the 2nd of September, there was little change in assignments of the Companies. "A" Company moved to vicinity OIRAVCIS to continue support of 818th combat team. "B" Company furnished Division support to 319th combat team. At 1900 hours, one plateon, "C" Company, was at ST MIHIEL, one plateon at MOREVILLE, one plateon at MOREVILLE, all elements establishing road blocks.

"B" Company had one platoon in vicinity of RAGNY\_3UR\_AUGO, one platoon in vicinity of VOID establishing read blocks. "G" Company was located at APREMOST. During the day, eleven (11) prisoners were captured by B Company, one PT by Company C, and mineteen (19) PET a by "A" Company. No casualties or lesses of equipment.

Battalies CP moved to vicinity of GIRAUTOISIN at 1115 hours, 3 Sept. One plateon of C Company was in support of one company of 317 combat team. Seized town of ESSAY against slight epposition. One plateon of C Company with 317th combat team set up defense of APROMORE.

On Sept 4, one platoon of G Company recommoitered for river crossing and gum positions along POUSLLE River between POUSLA-CUSSOR and Di COUCARD.

\*\*\*\* Company had a gum disposed at road 1-1/2 mile east of POUS, a gum at 1-1/2 miles south PACUY-SUR-SUR-SUR and another one mile south of EURO.

The Fattelien CP moved with 80th Division CP to violaity LI CHULLE. Field Message #5, 80th Infantry Division assigned Battelien missions as follows:

Two platoons, G Company attached to 1st Battalien, 317th Infantry in position 1 mile east of LIGHT and 3rd platoon attached to 2rd Satialien, 317th Infantry 1/2 mile east of PACUATE.

Infantry 1/2 mile east of PACUATE.

\*\*A\*\*\* Company in direct support 319th combat team in violaity AURIUM. The Company in direct support 319th combat team vicinity PAUATE.

Enemy artillery destroyed one gun of "" Company and inflicted three casualties on Sent 5. Company was in position vicinity "MANGAPOUT". One plateon, " longary was in position vicinity DT. DE TOFATOR, one plateon in vicinity of TOFE. "A" Company was in position vicinity A. DA (1. ad with 318th combat team. "C" Company had one plateon at EA DT of D. one plateon at UNDAIN-IEEE.

2nd Seco, 2nd platoon it Company is direct support of 2nd Setiction, 319th combat teem, received a direct hit by enemy artillery; losses, 7 casualties, 2 deaths, one sum a done belf-track destroyed at 0830 hours, 5 October. ... Harry B. Datkins, platoon leader was on of these killed. "B" Com say had one platoon at JPADDSERY, one section vicinity IT DE 1 - 2.870% and one platoon and CP vicinity PRESSERVED Like. Other dispositions unchanged.

On dept 7, """ Company waved to vicinity Sale Sale Sale in direct support 518th number near. They fined 55 rounds of BE accounting for 6 mediate gus positions and one enemy OP.

Tarly in the morning of Mept 8, the enemy launched a counter-stinck on positions compiled by 3rd platoon, "A" Company, 1-1/2 wiles 5% of GAIARMIS. The supporting Infantry fell hack without warning the platoon, and heavy mortar a d machine gum fire forced the platoon to fell back abandoning three Simch gums, three balf-tracks, and three 1/4 tons. The attack was halted about 1000 meters to the rear of the original positions by the reorganised Infantry. The enemy turned the Simch gues of our friendly units and one gum was destroyed by artillery fire and it was later determined that the other two gums were destroyed by 702md Tank Battelien. One matire gum crew has been reported missing. One platoon of "R" Company established a road black 1/2 mile south of GAIAGMIS. The 2md platoon, "A" Company, in position 2-1/2 miles 5E of Mide MIS. The 2md platoon, "A" Company, in position 2-1/2 miles 5E of Mide MIS. served activity in vicinity of enemy 6P. They held their fire until maximum number of personnel including a number of Officers retired into a tent. The platoon equipped fire on the position with Sinch FE.

Namy equalties straggled out of the test whereupen they fired 10 more rounds of HE sileneing the position. Estimated enemy casualties as 40. He further change in Esttalian position. It was later discovered that two of the three half-tracks previously reported as last were recovered and repaired. The 3rd half-track was destroyed by artillery fire.

Daring September 5th and 10th, there was little change in our position. 1st Section, Erd plateen, "F" Semany was in position at FT DB JCNDRK. VILLS. The 2nd Section in direct support of 3rd Settalion, 519th combat team, fired upon FT VILLSY LE 52C with very poor results against the fortification.

Daring the past week, the Esttalies had susceeded in changing the tracks on all 36 of our half-tracks without less of combat efficiency of any unit.

September 11, 1944: Battalien continued in direct support of the 80th Infantry Division with "A", "B", and "G" Companies supporting the 518th 519th, and 517th Regiments respectivily in the attack to establish a bridge-head agrees the MOSELLE River from PORT—A\_MOUSSON to MIDLERY. "G" Company spent the day preparing gum positions on high ground one mile SE of EZAIN—VILLE, to cover the Infantry crossing. Companies received replacements for the three gums and one half-track destroyed the previous day.

The attack to cross the MOSELLE River succeeded on the 12th of Sept and "A" and "C" Companies shuttled by plateons across the river taking up positions at Ste GRES.IEVE, BEZAUMONT, LANDRESMONT, and MILLERT, "W" Company remained in the same position. Buttalian CP moved to new position three miles south of WAMEY.

At about 0400 hrs, 13 September, the enemy launched a counter-attack against positions held by the 3rd plateon, "C" Company, in the term of STE GERS/IE/R. The Infantry support fell back but the plateon maintained their position against the Infantry and tank assumlt accounting for two of the enemy tanks, 1st Lt. Richard Merrill, the plateon leader, was wounded in the action.

In the same counter-attack, tanks advanced at 0415 hours, upon the read block established by 1st plateon, A Campany. It was too dark to identify the tanks so the plateon leader with-held his fire. The tanks at this junction, shot flares at our positions, blinding the TD crews and opened up with small arms. The plateon destroyed one enony tank but were forced to withdraw as they were then without Infantry support. The enemy tanks continued down the read south of LCISY where they were taken under fire by the 3rd plateon, "A" Company, in position two miles south of LOISY. They accounted for two (2) of the tanks. Our lesses were three (3) killed, four-teen (14) wounded, one 1-1/2 ton and one 1/4 ten destroyed. Enemy lesses five (5) MK IV tanks and four (4) machine gums. Company "B" had no change in position.

The action of  $^{\circ}G^{\circ}$  in maintaining their position in vicinity of STE GENEYIEVE against the Infantry and tank assault was credited with helping to a large extent the securing of the bridgehead over the MCSELLE River by the 80th Infantry Division.



On 15th September, the enemy again launched a counter-attack at 500380% HILL in vicinity of 3rd plateen, "A" Company. The plateon was subjected to a terrific barrage of machine gum, mortar, and small arms fire. The lat Section of the plateen advanced to the top of the hill with the Infantry, but the 2nd Section's route was blocked and personnel surrounded. They destroyed two of the gums while the two half-tracks made a dash for the top of the hill. Same of the crew numbers who were blocked succeeded in escaping by swimming the river. They succeeded in securing some boats and evacuated some of the wounded seress the river.

Another counter-attack was launched at 0400 in the ricinity of STE UPPERTY. Twhere Eq. Section and Srd plateon, To Tompeny were located. They knocked out two tanks with Basooks fire and two with Sinch guns. Capt. Rucheossis was wounded in this action.

Another tank attack was launched against this position at 1:00 hre. The lat platoon, "C" Company moved to a position covering this attack and kneeked out eight (8) enemy tanks from their position. The Division extillery teak the tank column under fire and dispersed the attack, although, Company was in position to take care of all tanks in the column. Later in the day, B Company moved to position in vicinity of LOIST.

Casualties were one man killed, three wounded, two munk lest and twelve (12) enemy tanks knocked out.

The enemy launched an attack supported by tenks against 1st plateen, "B" Company, position north of LOISY on the 16th September. Five (5) enemy tanks were destroyed, while five of our new were wounded and the trail of one gun was damaged. No change in Battalian disposition.

On 17 September, 1st plateon, "B" Company, moved to vicinity of FURVILLE\_SUE\_SELLUG, 2nd plateon to LESNINILS. To further change in disposition.

Battalion disposition on the 18th of September were as follows:

"A" Company had let and 3rd plateons in vicinity of LOISY, and 2nd plateon morth of LAUDERSHIT. "B" Company had let plateon west of PC.II-SUR\_SHILE, and 3rd plateon in vicinity of APTON.

"C" Company had let plateon at LIKIERUS, 2nd plateon NE of APTREVILLS, and 3rd plateon at all lands—VAL. Battalion OP had moved with Division to area morth of District and.

The 3rd plateon, "A" Company which had been cut off and isolated by the enemy for three days atep MOUSSON WILL with the 3rd Battalien, 318th Infantry, made a full report of their action. They had been supplied by air using Chb-planes and withsteed many hostile counter-attacks including a continual barrage of mortar, artillery, and small pros fire.

On September 19th, Bettalien CP moved with Division to location SE of JEZAINVILLE. The 1st plateon, "C" Company, supported the advance of the 3rd Battalien, 518th Infantry, from positions in vicinity of AUCRECIALE by knocking out at least three mortars and unknown number of personnel. 3rd plateon, "A" Company, moved in vicinity of VILLE-AU-VAL. The 2nd plateon, "A" Company, received artillery fire in vicinity of LOISY.

The lat plateen, "C" Company, fired 65 rounds of RE at targets of opportunity, supporting the advance of the 3rd Battelion, 318th Infantry es September 20. 3rd plateon, "C" Company, established a read block SE of LAUDRE. 'MONT. "A" Company had the 1st and 3rd plateons in the vicinity of STE GENEVIEVE

On the 21st of September, 2nd and 3rd plateon, Company "C", moved to violaity of BEARINGS in reserve ready to reinferce fires of Division enginet tank thrusts.

22nd of Deptember; 1st and 3rd plateons, "A" Company, moved to vicinity of Milath, 2nd plateon, "G" Company moved We of LALDREEDET and fired 16 rounds of BE on BELIRAU. Results were unobserved owing to poor visibility.

On September 26th, the Srd plateen, "C" Company, moved to PACA to reishonce the flank defences of the 517th Infantry.

On September 25th, the 808th T. D. Battalien, relieved the 610th T. D. Battalien. The 510th T. D.
