

The Bn (minus Companies B, C and 1 Plat of Company "A") remained in the town of Salzgitter, Germany guarding installations, doing maintenance and athletics. Co. "B" remained in Wolfbuttel, Germany (C92000). Platoons occupied AT positions in defence of the Division assembly area. 1B at coord (940117), 2B at coord. (926100) and (970100), 3B at coord. (910000).

Company "C" remained in support of CC"B" and assembled in the town of Schoningen, Germany (C215985).

232400 April 1945 326 Same Same

The 702nd T.D. Bn (minus Companies "B" and "C") plus Co "A", 82nd Rcn established additional road blocks and security outposts on all roads leading into the town of Salzgitter, Germany and all installations requiring protection. Assistance of men and armored vehicles given to local MP Detachment to search local camps for arms.

Company "B", in support of CC"A", checked blocks and outposts of CC"A". Two platoons remained in Braunschweig, Germany on half hour alert for enemy attack. One Platoon (3rd) released from duty on road blocks around Wolfenbuttel, Germany and assembled for reorganization and maintenance.

Company C in support of CC"B" remained in Schoffensted, Germany on one hour alert.

RESULTS: One SS Trouper in civilian clothes killed. 17 prisoners captured.

242400 April 1945 327 Same Same

Bn (Minus Companies "B" and "C") plus Company "A", 82nd Rcn remained in Salzgitter, Germany guarding installations and acting as policing force throughout area. A command inspection was held of personnel, barracks, and vehicles. A Reconnaissance party consisting of two platoons of Co "A"/82nd Rcn under the Battalion S-2 searched the woods North of town for reported enemy soldiers. Four PW's were captured.

Company "B" (less two platoons) remained in Wolfbuttel, Germany accomplishing maintenance, personal hygiene and athletics. One platoon under control of the 1st Bn, 66th Arm'd Regt remained on alert in Baunschweig, Germany. First platoon attached to 2nd Bn, 41st Arm'd Inf. Regt moved to Hunsen, Germany (P6292) to occupy road blocks in that vicinity.

Company "C" less third platoon remained in the vicinity of Schoningen, Germany (C215985) policing and garrisoning that town and surrounding area. Seven road blocks placed on main roads in area to enforce Division Military Government directives.

RESULTS: Bn Captured four (4) prisoners.

252400 April 1945 328 Same Same

The 702nd TD Bn remained in control of the town of Salzgitter Germany maintaining road blocks and interior police force and guard. Preparations made for care and billets of incoming displaced persons on order of the Division. Maintenance and athletics stressed for men not on duty. Pass schedule continued.

Company "B" (less two platoons) remained in Wolfenbuttel, Germany assisting the garrisoning of that town. Maintenance and athletics continued. One platoon under control of the 1st Bn, 66th Arm'd Regt in Hunsen, Germany (P6292) on road blocks.

Company "C" less 3rd platoon remained in the vicinity of Schoningen, Germany (C215985) policing and garrisoning that town and surrounding area. Seven roadblocks placed on main roads in area to enforce Division Military Government directives.

262400 April 1945 329 Same Same

The Bn remained in control of the town of Salzgitter, Germany

maintaining road blocks, guard and interior police force. Battalion made arrangements for billets of displaced persons expected to arrive during the day.

Reconnaissance Company moved to Immendorf,, Germany, taking over 17 displaced persons camps and made preparations to enforce regulations as ordered by Division.

One road block, consisting of a half-track and 4 enlisted men withdrawn from Gitter, Germany (795855) leaving one TD and 5 enlisted men on the outskirts of town.

The officer patrol was discontinued due to the number of officers needed for the new camps taken over by this unit.

Company "B" (less two platoons) moved to Salzgitter, Germany, closing in area 261800. Company to assist in the garrisoning of the town. Maintenance and athletics continued. First platoon under control of first Battalion, 66th Armored Regt., remained on alert in Braunschweig, Germany. Second Platoon attached to the 2nd Battalion, 41st Armored Inf. Regt. in Hunsen, Germany on road blocks.

Company "C" less third platoon remained in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany policing and garrisoning that town and surrounding area. Seven roadblocks placed on main roads in area to enforce Division Military Government directives.

RESULTS: 5 Enemy EM captured.

272400 April 1945 330 Same Immendorf, Germany (833978)

The 702nd T.D. Battalion moved from Salzgitter, Germany, to Immendorf (6 Miles) and was placed in command of 17 Displaced persons camps in Immendorf, Germany, responsible for moving displaced persons through area towards their own countries.

Co. "A" relieved of road blocks and security in the town of Salzgitter, Germany by Company "B".

Company "C" less third platoon remained in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany. Company continued policing and garrisoning of the town. No change in road blocks or patrols.

RESULTS: Company "C" captured 35 German Prisoners (EM).



282400 April 1945 331 Same Same

The 702nd Tank Destroyer Battalion (-) remained in the vicinity of Immendorf, Germany (C833978). Battalion is in command of 17 displaced persons camps in that vicinity, responsible for housing and rations. Bn moving the personnel on Division orders to points to be shipped out.

Co. "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany accomplishing maintenance personal hygiene and athletics.

Co. "C" (less third platoon) in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany policing and garrisoning the town. No change in road blocks.

Co. "B" (less two platoons) in Salzgitter, Germany. Company maintaining road blocks and security in the town. 1st platoon remained under control of the 1st Battalion, 66th Arm'd Regt; 2nd Platoon under control of 2nd Bn, 41st Arm'd Inf. Regt.

RESULTS: Company "C" captured 6 German Prisoners (EM).

292400 April 1945 332 Same Same

The 702nd Tank Destroyer Battalion (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany (C833978). Approximately twelve hundred displaced persons collected in the camps under Battalion control. The movements of 1200 D.P.'s each ordered for HILDENSCHEIN and KALTENDORF, GERMANY but cancelled. One shipment of 500 French D.P.'s moved to KALTENDORF, GERMANY, 28 April 1945. All Tuberculosis patients moved from Camp NO.24 to Civilian Hospital.

Company "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany accomplishing maintenance, personal hygiene and athletics.

Company "B" (less two platoons) in Salzgitter, Germany, maintaining road blocks and security in the town. 1st Platoon remained under control of the 1st Battalion 66th Armored Regt., 2nd Platoon under control of the 2nd Battalion, 41st Armored Inf., Regt.

Company "C" less third platoon in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany policing and garrisoning the town. No change in road blocks.

302400 April 1945 333 Same Same

The 702nd Tank Destroyer Battalion (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany (C833978). All camps continued cleaning process and now available for approximately 8000 additional D.P.'s.

Company "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany maintaining road blocks, and security in the town. The 1st Platoon remained under control of the 1st Bn, 66th Armored Regt; 2nd Platoon under control of the 2nd Bn, 41st Armored Inf. Regt.

Company "C" less third platoon in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany policing and garrisoning the town. No change in road blocks. Maintenance and athletics stressed.

012400 May 1945 334 Same Same

The 702nd Tank Destroyer Bn (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany. Camps continued cleaning and sterilization of the buildings.

Company "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany accomplishing maintenance, personal hygiene and athletics.

Company "B" (less two platoons) in SALZGITTER, Germany maintaining road blocks and security of the town. No change in attachments.

Company "C" less third platoon in the vicinity of Scheningen, Germany policing and garrisoning the town. No change in road blocks.

022400 May 1945 335 Same Same

Bn (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany. All camps continued cleaning of buildings and surrounding area.

Bn shipped out 3700 displaced persons during the morning hours.

Co. "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany. Company continued maintenance on all vehicles, radios and weapons. Athletics stressed during the afternoon.

Co. "B" (less two platoons) in Salzgitter, Germany. Company remained in road blocks and security placed throughout the town.

Co. "C" (less one Platoon) remained in Scheningen, Germany continuing the police and garrisoning of that town. No change in road blocks.

RESULTS: Company "C" captured 13 German Soldiers.

032400 May 1945 336 Same Same

Bn (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany (C833978), continuing cleaning of camps, maintenance of camp utilities and collecting of personnel by nationalities. 1000 Russians shipped out during the morning hours.

Company "A" remained in Salzgitter, Germany. 1st platoon relieved of attachment of CC"R" and reverted to Battalion control assembling in Salzgitter, Germany. Company continued maintenance on vehicles, radios and weapons.

Company "B" in Salzgitter, Germany, remained on road blocks in that vicinity. Continued a roving patrol for security and to enforce civilian curfew hours.

Company "C", in Scheningen, Germany, continuing the police and garrisoning of the town. T.D.'s remained on road blocks.

Bn(-) remained in Immendorf, Germany. Continued cleaning of camps, maintenance of camp utilities and collection of PW's and Displaced persons. Camps checked daily by a medical officer and all discrepancies being corrected. 2000 Russians shipped out during the morning.

Companies "A", "B" and "C" remained on road blocks and continued security and policing of the towns. Maintenance on vehicles and radios and weapons.

RESULTS: Company "C" captured 18 PW's.

052400 May 1945 338 Same Same
Bn (-) remained in Immendorf, Germany (C833978), maintenance of vehicles and radios. Continued cleaning of camps, maintenance of camp utilities and collection of displaced persons. Sanitary conditions remained satisfactory throughout the camps. 1000 Russians shipped to Magdeburg, Germany by rail during the morning.

Companies "A", "B" and "C" remained on road blocks and continued policing of the towns. Security patrols continued and curfew hours enforced.

062400 May 1945 339 Same Same
Bn (-) remained in the vicinity of Immendorf, Germany. Maintenance on vehicles (6000 mile check) and radios. All racks being removed and vehicles repainted. Continued cleaning of camps and collecting Displaced Persons. 1050 French and 210 Belgians shipped out by truck during the morning.

Companies "A", "B" and "C" remained on road blocks and continued security patrols to enforce the curfew hours.

072400 May 1945 340 Same Same
Bn (-) remained in the vicinity of Immendorf, Germany. Maintenance on vehicles (6000 mile check) and radios. All vehicles being cleaned and repainted. Continued cleaning of camps and collecting Displaced persons. Sanitary conditions satisfactory throughout the camps. 1126 Belgians and 24 Dutch PW's shipped out at 1130 hours.

Companies "A", "B", and "C" remained on road blocks, security patrols continued to enforce curfew hours.

082400 May 1945 341 Same Same
Bn remained in the vicinity of Immendorf, Germany, continuing maintenance and painting of all vehicles.
Sanitary conditions of all camps is satisfactory. 1200 French PW's shipped out at 081100 May 1945.

Companies "A" and "B" remained in Salzgitter, Germany continuing security patrols to enforce the curfew hours.

Company "C" moved to Gr. Heere, Germany (C723880), closing in area 081415 May 1945.

092400 May 1945 342 Same Sehlde, Germany (C735856)
The Bn (-) moved from Immendorf, Germany, 10 miles to Sehlde, Germany (C735856) closing in area 091125 May 1945. Bn relieved of all displaced persons camps by 83rd Infantry Division, effective 091200 may 1945. 231 French Displaced persons and 976 French PW's shipped out at 091155 May 1945.

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. Swimming and athletics during the morning, Mothers Day and Memorial Service held during the afternoon.

142400 May 1945 347 Same Same

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. All Companies completed a showdown inspection of vehicles and vehicular equipment. Close Order drill and practice Formal Guard Mount during the afternoon.

152400 May 1945 348 Same Same

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. The day was spent on maintenance and repacking of tools and turret compartments; Inspection of vehicles parts and vehicles. Practice for Memorial Ceremony and Retreat during the afternoon.

162400 May 1945 349 Same Same

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. All Companies had practical work in Scouting and patrolling during the morning. The afternoon consisted of athletics and a Memorial Parade.

All weapons checked by a Division Ordnance inspection team.

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. Maintenance and discussion of I and E plans.

Bn remained in the vicinity of Sehlde, Germany. Training in scouting and patrolling for Reconnaissance Company and the security sections of the Gun Companies. Remainder of the Battalion went on a tactical walk, paying particular attention to cover, concealment and defilade.

A provisional Company participated in the Division Review at 1800 today.
