Report of combat activity of this organization covering period 16 Harch -11 April 1943 follows:

#### REACOND OF EVENIES:

16 March - In bivound 13 miles at AINE BEIDA

17 March - Battalion merched at 0001 hrs to visinity of WELEPIS airport via TEHESSA in compliance with F.O. M., Hq. 1st TD Group, 16 March 1943. Moniony To protoct THEIRPIE airport from mechanized attack. Glosed in assembly area 6845 hrs. Battalion moved at 1900 hrs to FERIAMA, in compliance with F.O. #5, Hq. let TD Group, 17 March 1943. Missions To provide local defense of Headquartors, II Corps, U. S. Amp. By 2330 hre, nocessary roadblocks, night time listening posts, and gun positions were established by all soupenies, covering 260° are around FERIANA.

18 March - By 0930 hrs. daytime gun positions and necessary minefields were established by all companies.

20 March - Dattalion moved from PERIANA at 1245 hrss and closed in ascembly area 1 mile HW of SHATTLA 1700 hrs. in compliance with V.O. C.O. 1st ID Group, Missions To support 9th Int. Div. in static defense of SHEITLA-KAS PAINE area in conjunction with SWith TD; 1 Day 17th Inf. Golumn straigd by three (3) enery planes 2 miles NW SERITIA 04:30 hrs. - cosmulties 2 killed, 6 wounded, 3 vehicles and guns damaged and 1 - 37mm mtd vehicle destroyed. At 1600 Hrs: battalion same under command of C.O. 894th TD Bn. At 2300 hrs. forward C.P. and gun positions established 2-3 miles from SHITLA on road to HAD.EEB EL AIGUN. Asconnaissance are established 3 miles 12 of SERITIA.

21 Karch - One company established gun positions 2 miles east of SINITIA on SIDI ROU ZID road: prior to 1200 hrs. Recon. outcosts established at T5106, T5581 and T5166 (TURISIAN 1/200,000 MAP: SIMITIA). Contact also was established w/Derb.Yecmonry and Rocon. elements of 34th Inf. Division. No energy contact.

22 March - At 2135 hrs. gun position on SIDI ROU ZID road was reinforced by one platoon as per verbal orders of C. O. 894th TD Bn., based on unconfirmed report of enemy tank column moving west of FAID.

23 March - Laid minefields.

- 26 March Bn. departed SECITLA approx. 2200 hrs. in compliance w/radio message C. G. Div Arty., 9th Div. received 1100 hrs., 25 March 1943.
- .27 March Orders changed enroute by authority contained in phone message from C. G., II Corps relayed thru Hq. 9th Inf. Div. placing SO5th TD Dn. under dormand of C.G., Corps Artillery, II Corps. Battalion closed OSCO hrs. in ass'y area 2 mi. MS of GAFSA on MAREADSY road. Mission: To provide anti-mach. defense for Corps Artillery. C.F. and gun positions accupied 2000 hrs. in wadis 4 miles SE of EL GREPTAR along road to GARES.
- 29 March Random energy shellfirs landed in area. Attacked by dive bombers at 1630 hrs. - no casualties.
- 30 March Energy plane dropped flares and bombs over area at 0300 hrs. Casualties - 1 killed, 1 vehicle damaged.
- 31 March Departed EL GUESTAR 1300 hrs. in compliance w/VOCG II Corps. Glosed in ass'y area SENED STATION at 1700 hrs. Mission: To provide secondary defense line against mechanized attack from the north, northeast or east, under command of C.G. 1st Armored Division. 2 enemy planes dive bombed IP at 1330; no casualties.
- 1 April Departed ass'y area at 1300 hrs. and occupied position of readiness 1730 hrs. 4 mi. MW SENED STATION (in compl. W/ltr CG 1st Armored Division 31 March 1943 as amended verbally). Mission - unchanged, 8-10 mile recon. radius established and close cooperation with Derby.Necembry effected.
- 2 April Preparation of alternate gun positions continued. SEMED PASS patrolled and guarded.
- April Departed SENED STATION 1400 hrs. by infiltration in compl.
  w/VOCG let Armored Division, placing this organisation under the command of Col. J. J. Williams, Force Comdr., operating under II Corps. Closed in reconnoitered C.P. and gun positions at T-2715 with A Company in position at T-2735 (TUNISIAN 1/200,000 MAP: SEMITIA). A and Ron. Companies removed from control of commanding officer 805th TD Ba.

5 April - This battalion (minus A and Becon. Companies) departed T-2715 at 1300 hrs. in compl. w/VOOG II Corps and closed in assy area 7 miles N. of GAFSA at 1530 hrs. At this time WOOG II

Corps placed this organization under command of the G. C. the let Manger Bu. Rission: To provent energy mechanized thrust into GAFSA from Southwestern tip of Diskill High. Devlight recon, southeast of MEDIMA was assouted at 1630 hrs. for night occupation of position.

6 April - Forward C.F. and gun positions SE of MEDILLA occupied at OSOD hrs. At 1230 hrs. withdrew from MEDILLA area in coupl. w/VOCG II Corps and returned to associly area 7 miles ME of GAF3A on GAFSA- SIDI MAKID road. Ordered to DEFITIA there to report to Col. J. J. Williams by GH II Corps. A and Rom. Companies remained deteched.

7 April - Glossd in temporary bivouse 2 miles east of SHAITLA at 0200 hrs. As of 1200 hours B and C Gespaniss were removed from control of this Battalion and attached to force protecting airfield at 2-2735. Battalion C. C. given mission of coordinating activities of rear schelens of WILLIAMS FORCE. During afternoon 02, 604 lst Armored Division assumed command of this force.

8 April - Battalion ordered by CO, COA to position of readinase at T-5751. Mission: To prevent energy debouccement from FAID area. Battalion closed new area at 1900 hours. A and Becch. Companies reverted to Battalion at same time. Two mon wounded by anti-personnal mines.

9 April - Encay minefields in and about SIDI B/U ZID cleared by this organisation. One officer wounded by encay anti-personnel mine in SIDI B/U ZID. Observation post on DJB/EEL ESAIRA complete by Ren. elements of this organisation prior to 1730 hrs.

10 - 11 April - Departed SIDI BOU 210 area at 1000 hrs., 10 April 1943, attached to CCA. Mission of CCA: To move to and occupy area at 3-9768 by way of pass 5 miles south of FAID. Battalion proyided C Company for advance guard and B and Rom. Companies for flank guard of CCA. Battalion closed in area in vicinity of T-9788 by 0200 hrs. 11 April 1943, induding companies forming populane of flank and advance guards.

12 April - Departed 1900 hre, in cospi. with V.O.C.G. let Areared Div. and closed in bivouse 5 siles ME of 1900 CHENKA, reverting to control of Cosmanding Officer, let TD Group.

# Comments and Becommendations Conserning Employment Of This Unit.

COMMENTE: 1.

It is believed that the mission assigned to this Battalion upon arrival in the SSMED STATION area may have been too ambiticus - many squaremiles were involved and no supporting or protecting troops were furnished. At this time, it is believed that MENED PASS was quite vulnerable to enemy infantry penetration.

- 2. The assignment of this battalion to the Col. J. J. Williams Force in the SHEITLA-KASHERINE area is felt to have been rather vague. Not only was Col. Williams' or his C.P.'s location not known, nor the specific mission of this battalion understood, but the battalion was divided into three parts; supply, medical aid and evacuation were not provided detached units by this headquarters to which attached. Under these conditions the battalion minus A and Ren. Companies were ordered to GAFSA area. This latter mission might have proved a serious and difficult one.
- 3. Casualties were suffered during a daylight march to SHETTLA. The necessity for marching during daylight. did not appear apparent at this time.

#### RECOMENDATIONS:

- 1. That this battalion be kept intact as a battalion.
- 3. That night marching be utilized whenever feasible.
- 4. That personnel replacement be coordinated with vehicle replacement. Throughout the period covered by this report, a large number of immobile troops were contained in this battalion.
- 5. Infantry missions should not be assigned this Battalion.
- 6. That separate battalions be placed under one permanent administrative authority rather than having such authority change with tactical assignments. This will preclude much duplication of reports which are never useful to the unit to which attached due to constant shifting of Battalion to another force or command. Will also eleminate many
