Camp Bowie is the proud preserver of one of the finest and meet complete libraries in any army postation energies housing over 9,000 books.

Twelve hundred of these volumes whose subject matters, runs from Emily Fost to the best contemporary fiction, are taken out by Officers and Enlisted Men each month.

Mrs. Smith, librarian, states, that the boys' chief interest lies in popular fiction, biography, radio and aeronautics.
