- 1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures -
 - A. Patrol consisting of 2 mem Co A and 10 guerrillas drew rigle fire (about 5 rds) from a wooded hill—side vicinity (98.60-05.75) about 1100 13 May. One of the guerrillas reported having seen 5 Japs withdraw and move north into the hills. Conflicting stories told by civilians indicate that a group of Japs (5 to 10 in number) frequently came at night into the barrio about 2 miles south of this point (98.60-05.75); demand food, cook it in the vicinity same night or following morning before returning to the hills.
 - b. 12 May Sgt Murray, Go A in charge of guerrillas in Licab received information from a civilian that two Japs were sleeping in a house about 2 kilos south of LICAB (54.58-83.40).

 Investigating patrol found no definite evidence of the enemy.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures Patrol consisting of 2 mem Co A, and 12 guerrillas
heard 7 rifle shots in the vicinity of GANDUS at
OSSO. Investigated and found 10 civilians (6 of them
children) in the vicinity (893.91-1903.89) who had
in their possession 2 Ml Garand rifles, 1 Jap hand
gremade, 2 US fragmentation hand gremades, 4 rifle
grenades, 1 grenade launcher, and 1 lb. TNT with fuse
and cord, all of which was confiscated by the patrol.

Cpl Divergigelis of Co A, in charge of the patrol, questioned a civilian bearing arms and who claimed he was Pfc Marcelo Salamanca but later admitted to be Maximo Salamance, brother of a guerrilla and that he borrowed the gun from his brother.

Another civilian, Antonio Rollian, his his Ml rifle when the patrol approached him. This was known to be a fact upon examining other riffle and discovering it had not been fired recently. After claiming he did not have a rifle, Rollian finally turned his weapon over to the patrol. Rollian then told the patrol he borrowed PFs Ismail Vallente's rifle for a fishing trip.

Both Maximo Salamance and Antonic Rellian had passes in their possession authorizing Pfc Marcelo Salamance and Pfc Ismail Vallente to carry arms to pick up AWLS of the 303 Squadron in SAN JOSE.

Patrol believed these two men to be pro-Japanese and brought them to RIZAL and put them under arrest for further questioning.



SUBJECT: Periodic Report (Period 1800 20 May - 1800 21 May)

TO: Commanding General, I Corps, APO 301 (Attn: Col Goodyear, Asst G-4)

Enemy Action and Countermeasures -RIZAL - Co A patrol found body of dead Filipino civilian on road in town of SAN JUAN at 1100. This Hq notified FCAU #3, SAN JOSE, of the particulars at 1600. LAUR - At 0800 a report was received at OF of 7 Japanese in SICIONG (909.0-1884.5) Patrol consisting of 2 men to A and 22 guerrillas left at 0830 and arrived in SICIONG at 0945. Patrol met civilian who reported several Japanese hiding in banana grove (909.0-1884.2). Patrol proceeded to this point, moving through the grove from S to N, sighted 2 Japanese and killed them with a volley of shots fired by patrol and armed civilians. Patrol then moved back through grove and civilian operating with our unit killed one more Jap. At 1200 patrol stopped to eat dinner as there were apparently no more Japa in the area. At 1300 a civilian reported 3 more Japs in Lanana Grove. Upon sighting our patrol, the enemy retreated to wooded area (908.6-1884.0). Patrol gave chase and killed all 3 with concentrated fire from the entire unit. Between 1230 and 1300 a platoon from Co A 136th Inf arrived at SICIONG. They decided to flush out ravine '809.2-1884.4) one man Co A. 826th Amph Trac and 10 guerrillas were posted around edge to kill any Japs who might come out. The Inf plat moved into ravine and killed 3 Japs one of whom was armed with a rifle Jap cal 25. None of the Japanese killed (9) carried any manus papers, insignia of rank or other identification. were armed with 1 grenade (Jap) or more. Patrol left Siciong at 1630 and arrived OP 1730. Casualties Co A, 826th Amph Trac - none.

Enemy Action and Countermeasures -BONGABON - Two (2) Japs were killed in the civ of bridge (898.5-1894.0) 1 kilometer N of VEGA GRANDE (898.5-1893.7). One Jap was killed about 0730 by guerrillas atchd to Co C, 775 Tk Bn, (the guerrillas are bridge gds) The other Jap was killed about 1000 by joint action of Co A, 826th Amph Trac Bn and Co C. 775 Tk Bn patrols from BONGABON after the Jap had been trailed to the area. Co A patrol at BONGABON confiscated two (2) rifles. One (1) rifle, Springfield M1903, cal. 30, No. 2077019 from Serafin Revera who lives in SAGANA barrio, LAUR; one (1) rifle Jap cal. .25, No. 02084 from Jose Cabrera who lives in HONGABON. LAUR - 2 Japs fired upon #2 outpost at 2315. An alert squad left CP and investigated the firing immediately. These men returned fire but the Japs escaped to the west across the rice paddies.
