



UNIT HISTORY

The Battalion throughout the month of April, 1945, has been devoted to combat support duty under an assignment to 6th Army Group for operational control by A. C. of S, G-2 Section, 6th Army Group. The Battalion was attached to 7th Army for administration and supply, but on the 30th of April, 1945, was relieved and attached to Special Troops, 6th Army Group, for administration and supply in order to achieve simplification.

The essential operation of the unit was the effective conduction of a Camp, billeting and transporting members of 6th Army Group T-Section.

One company, implemented by members of a second, furnished a guard detail for a Signal Unit under 6th Army Group. The CO of the Signal Unit expressed his complete satisfaction with our unit and desired its continuance in the same capacity.

The function of supply was quite adequate and no extreme difficulties were experienced.


No casualties were suffered and no combat service was experienced during the month.

The Medical Detachment served well and efficiently for this period.

Three officers returned from Temporary Duty with the 824th TD Battalion. There was a loss of one officer by transfer and a gain of four EM during April.

The Battalion CP was moved from KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany, to LEIMEN, Germany, in order to facilitate the administrative functioning of the battalion.

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


The month of April, 1945, was spent conducting a camp for T-Section, 6th Army Group.
