Awarded: Silver Star

Date action: 5 September 1968 Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For gallantry in action against an armed hostile force in the of Vietnam. Lieutenant Colonel Russell distinguished himself intrepid actions on 5 September 1968 while serving as battalio commander of the 4th Battalion, 3d Infantry, 11th Infantry Bri; On that date, Company D, 4th Battalion, was participating in O Champaign Grove when they made contact with a dug in hostile forundetermined size. During the initial exchange of fire, the company sustained two wounded and one killed. Realizing that the wounded men needed medical attention, Colonel Russell ordered the pilot of his command and control helicopter to land and evacuate them. He then ordered the pickup zone marked with smoke. Coming in on a short final approach, his aircraft began receiving heavy hostile automatic weapons fire from three locations. Prior to touchdown and short of the pickup zone, the aircraft crashed. Disregarding the heavy enemy automatic weapons fire directed at the aircraft, Colonel Russell remained in the helicopter to check the wounded. After assisting the wounded aircraft commander from the downed chopper, Colonel ussel pulled the mortally wounded artillery liaison officer from e aircraft. By this time personnel from Company D arrived at the ash site. They assisted Colonel Russell in moving the wounded pilot d dead artillery officer to a safe position. Colonel Russell en returned to the downed helicopter, acquired a radio, and began lling in gunships and artillery fire against the insurgents. der his direction, armed helicopters, artillery, and ground forces ffectively neutralized the hostile positions. Lieutenant Colonel ussell's personal heroism, professional competence, and devotion duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military ce and reflect great credit upon himself, the Americal Divis nited States Army.
